Change Your School Books. Every district officer in the county has been furnished with a copy of the text book circular issued by the state board of education giving all necessary information relative to the change of school text books recently made by the state board of text book commissioners.

Since the time in which the text books now in use can be exchanged for the new ones of like grade at about half the regular retail price, expires December 31 of this year, I especially request every school officer and every patron of our public schools to attend to this matter promptly and thus make the expense of this change of school books as light as possible.

The Curson Coal & Navigation Company have purchased the Wall coal property on Isthmus slough, and active work in the development of the mine, will be commenced immediately. Messrs. Curson and Maxwell are heavy stockholders in the company and have a good market for the output of the mine.

We are assured that the sinking of the shaft at Coos City will not be delayed on account of the purchase of the Wall property, but that work there will be pushed as rapidly as possible. On the land just purchased, two veins of coal have already been opened, which will aid the company considerably in the rapid development of the mine, and it is reasonable to assume that shipments will be made in the not far distant future. Messrs. Maxwell and Curson have had much previous experience in coal mining, in which they have been very successful, and there is no reason to doubt but that their investment here will prove profitable to them and to this section of the country generally.—Coos Bay News.
