C., was wrecked Thursday morning at 4:10 by a French four-masted bark, The Walla Walla had 64 passengers aboard, and 45 are reported drowned. The collision occurred 20 miles south of Mendocino Bay. The French bark struck the Walla Walla in the bow. At the time of the collision the second officer was on the bridge. No definite information can be learned as to the cause of the accident, as all aboard were sleeping.
