The Corbin Company are having the road improved between Mussel Creek and Frankport, with the purpose of hauling their lumber to that port for shipment.

There are lively times out at the Adolphus mill, on Elk River, with promise that the activity will increase for sometime to come. A large number of men are now employed in improving the road, building bunkalations and residences and placing machinery in the mill. It is the purpose to begin the shipment of cedar lumber as early as a date as possible.

The rush for timber land is now on in this vicinity, and about all the available timber land on Elk River is being located. It is not being taken by non resident speculators, but by permanent citizens of the county, who begin to realize that all timber lands of the coast are rapidly increasing in value. The great obstacle in the way of most of these locations, however, is that the lands are either unsurveyed or the surveys have not been approved.

## Pacific Homestead.

Prizes of 20 and \$10 have been offered to the students of the Washington Agricultural College making the best record in livestock judging in the beef classes, the contest to be held in May or June next.

Nurserymen in all parts of the Northwest report an active business in the sale of new stock, all of which points to an increased acreage in the orchards, of course. The farmers are determined to grow more and better fruit in future.

The gasoline schooner Copper Queen arrived in Portland on March 2, with about 3000 feet of oak, myrtle and alder lumber, which was shipped to San Francisco. The lumber was cut by a mill at Rogue river, and the schooner headed for Coos Bay, but unfavorable weather drove her north and she entered the Columbia.—Oregon Timberman.

In the Marion county (Or.) recorder's office recently a hop contract, covering 12,000 pounds of the 1902 crop, was filed, the consideration being 2 1/2 cents—6 cents to be advanced for picking purposes. This is a noticeable advance over any contract so far filed or mentioned in this section of the Northwest and certainly indicates that hops will bring a good price next fall.

At the Oregon Agricultural College and Experiment Station farm, a 4-months old Shorthorn calf is making a gain in weight of more than a pound a day. March 1st he weighed 465, and on March 10th 477 pounds, or 12 pounds in 10 days. His mother is a thoroughbred shorthorn, owned by the college, and weighed over 1700 pounds last summer.
