The Ranch says that the state dairy law of Washington should be so amended as to limit the amount of water incorporated in butter to 15 per cent by weight.

The trouble may be remedied, however, by the law regulating the sale of oleomargarine and process butter recently enacted by Congress.

Every person who carries on the business of a manufacturer of adulterated butter without having paid the tax is subject to a fine of not less than one thousand and not more than five thousand dollars.

The English courts hold that butter which contains more than 16 per cent of water is adulterated. It is probable that courts in this country will find from the evidence that 16 or a larger percentage of water in butter is an abnormal amount.

Captain John Bergman, of the Umpqua Life Saving Station, captured a fish in the Umpqua river last week, which from its large size grotesque appearance, and peculiarities of organization is baffling the intelligence of Umpqua naturalists.
