Teachers Institute.

The Annual Teachers Institute for Coos county will convene at 1 p. m. Aug. 4th, 1902 at Myrtle Point and continue till the evening of the 7th.

The growth of the school the past year was sixty per cent over the preceding year, with an excellent prospect for the coming year.

The U. S. Civil Service Commission will hold examinations, during September and October, in several places in each state to secure young men and women for the government service.
