The "Professional Womens' League" proposes giving a "Womens' exhibition" in New York which will employ 3,000 women and involve an outlay of \$250,000. Every capacity even to carriage attendants will be filled women.

Since Congress convened last fall there have been 1,703 persons legislated into the civil service. This is, of course entirely opposed to civil service reform; but then Congress never has shown much disposition to further that reform.

A British company has been formed with the object of mooring, 110 miles west of the coast, a vessel which will be used as a relay station for wireless telegraph system. This station will have wire communication with the shore and will receive the first news from incoming, and the last news from outgoing vessels, which will be communicated to land by wire.

Hon. Henry A. Castle, auditor for the Post Office Department, is much gratified at the showing of a surplus for two of the three quarters of the last fiscal year. It is estimated that when the whole year is audited the deficit will be in the neighborhood of \$3,000,000 which will be an extraordinary reduction from the usual deficits before the present strict rulings on second class matter were customary.
