The U. S. Civil Service Commission will hold examinations, during September and October, in several places in each state to secure young men and women for the government service. There are now 126,423 positions in the classified civil service, being an increase of 46,736 in six years. There were 7,972 persons appointed between July 1, 1901, and April 15, 1902, being at the rate of 10,070 for the year. There will probably be 11,000 appointments next year. Salaries at appointment vary from \$660 to \$1,200 a year with liberal promotions afterward. All appointments are for life and for most positions only a common school education is required. Politics or religion is not considered. Those desiring to take examinations of this kind can get full information about them free by writing to the Columbia Correspondence College, Washington, D. C., and asking for its Civil Service Catalogue for 1902.

The State Department has been notified that the American officers who will attend the German Army maneuvers need not bring horses, as the Emperor will furnish fully-equipped mounts. Generals Corbin, Young and Wood are the officers invited.

The asphalt trust, with headquarters in Washington, has called prices down to meet those of a non-trust company that secured a contract in competition with it last summer, and the District of Columbia expects in future to save from 20 to 30 cents a square yard on the asphalt work done annually.

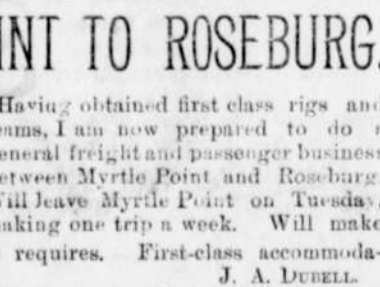
