Eleven Killed in a Furious Battlepitched battle took place at Wright's profit over and above their excoal works, in Raleigh county, last penses. evening, between 100 United States Deputy Marshals and Deputy Sher-Deputy Marshals and Deputy Sheriffs, under Chief Deputy Cunningham, of Charleston, and Sheriff
Cook, of Releigh county, and 250
striking miners who refused to permit Federal officers to serve injunction papers. The posse met with a
mob armed with Winchesters, opening fire on the deputies at once.

The deputies responded and the
battle raged furiously tor several minutes. Eight strikers were killed, Ohio Railroad was shot in the arm. A striker slipped up on him and fired. Smith dodged the bullet in-tended for his heart and received it

in his arm. He then killed the striker with a pistol. After the posse had repulsed the miners they followed up their advantage, and secured the arrest of over 100, who were brought to Beckley under guard. Deputy Cunningham and posse have gone back to the scene and will arrest every one implicated. An ugly strike in progress is the cause of the trouble. Most of the mob are foreigners.

North Platt, Neb., Feb. 24.—The marriage of Miss Irma Cody, daughter of Colonel Wm. F. Cody, and support in the past. Lieut. 
