The following was received by G. W. Wimer, of Fishtrap, from his brother who left here several weeks ago in company with Frank and George Collier and their families:

DEAR BROTHER AND FAMILY:

I will drop you a line to let you know how and where we are. This leaves all tolerably well, and we have had a good trip so far, but it is pretty hot here and water is scarce. We will go to the Sacramento river tomorrow. We will be about 16 miles from Sacramento where we will stay a few days and fish some. We haven't killed but one deer since we left home. Our horses are standing the trip all right.

Mr. and Mrs. George Collier will leave tomorrow. They will go to the coast in Sauoma county. He says he has seen all of this valley that he wishes to. I think we will go on down the valley and strike the coast about San Francisco.

Fred is getting along fine. We came near losing him a few nights ago. We changed his food and it did not agree with him at the start, but he is all right again.

Well I have seen a whole lot since we started, but nothing I like as well as Coos. They only pay \$15 and \$20 per month for driving 8 and 10 miles and furnish one lantern while two are needed.

There is nothing where we will be when you get this, so we do not know where to tell you to write yet.
