Petition and Citation.

IN THE COUNTY COURT FOR COOS COUNTY, STATE OF OREGON.

In the matter of the petition of J. W. Bennett and others for the organization of a dyking District to be numbered No. —

To the Honorable, the County Court, above named:

Your Petitioners, Flanagan & Bennett Bank, a corporation, Jas. H. Flanagan, J. W. Bennett, R. F. Williams, George Winchester and Bennett Swanton, would respectfully represent and show:

That petitioner Flanagan & Bennett Bank, above named, is a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Oregon;

That each of the above named petitioners is the owners of a separate parcel of land within the boundaries of the hereinafter described proposed dyking district, and that together petitioners are the owners of more than one half of the total acreage of the said proposed dyking district.

That the lands included within the said proposed dyking district are subject to overflow by tide water and by freshets and would so overflow unless dykes be constructed and maintained thereon and the dyke, which is already there, be repaired and maintained;

That the said dyke, which is already existing upon said premises was intirely constructed at the expense of these petitioners and their predecessors in title, and that the same is now in great need of repairs;

That it is desired to form a dyking district of the hereinafter described proposed dyking district so as to improve said premises by dyking the same and by repairing and maintaining the said dyke already constructed there;

The said proposed dyking district is described as follows, to-wit: Lots One, Two and Three, and the Northwest 1/4 of the Northwest 1/4 and the North 1/4 of the Northeast 1/4 of Section 17; the South 1/4 of the Southeast 1/4 of Section 8; Lot One of Section 16; Lots 3 and 4 and the Southeast 1/4 of the Northwest 1/4 of the Southwest 1/4, and the Southeast 1/4 of the Southeast 1/4 of the Northwest 1/4 of Section 9 all in Township 28 South, Range 14 West of the Willamette Meridian, and in Coos County, Oregon, containing 440.39 acres, of which 232.26 acres are owned by petitioners.

WHEREFORE YOUR PETITIONERS PRAY That the Court appoint three disinterested persons, who are non-residents of the said proposed dyking district, as viewers to view out and survey such dykes and dams in said proposed dyking district as to said viewers shall seem proper and expedient, and to provide for the placing of the dyke already constructed in thorough repair and up to a uniform standard, and make report to this Court of their doings, as by law required;

That this Court make an order directing the Clerk of this Court to cause this petition to be published for four successive weeks in the official newspaper of this County, and also a notice to interested parties fixing a time for the hearing of this petition and the report of the viewers;

That upon the hearing of this petition and the report of said viewers this Court make an order declaring the said premises, as corrected, viewed and surveyed by the viewers, a dyking district, and thereupon appoint from among the land owners thereof a Superintendent of such dyking district. And your petitioners will ever pray etc.
