ARRESTED FOR SEDUCTION.

W. E. Clark of Jefferson to be Tried To-day for This Offense.

W. E. Clark of Jefferson, was arrested and brought to this city by Constable C. G. Burkhardt, charged with seduction, the charge being preferred by Miss Elva C. Pomeroy, of Scio. The plaintiff is a daughter of L. W. Pomeroy, of that place, and is of a highly respectable family, and has brought the action because the defendant refused to marry her, under promise of which he accomplished her seduction. Clark was placed in jail in default of \$500 bonds to await his trial at 1 o'clock to-day in Justice Humphrey's court.

THE MONMOUTH MURDER.

MONMOUTH, Dec. 30. Yesterday our quiet town was disturbed by the foulest murder ever committed in it since it became a town. The victims of the deed were two inoffensive china men Lee Gee and Ton Tin Law the latter commonly called "Sook eye" on account of the shape of his eyes. For several years these chinamen have had the entire trade of the town in the laundry business and were supposed to have considerable money saved from their earnings. This fact has no doubt been the cause of the deed. Early this morning Messrs Geo Atkins and Eldon Haley went to the laundry to get their weeks washing and though repeated calls were made no response was given not suspecting as yet anything wrong, as the mongolians habit of late sleeping was well known, they passed to the rear of house and were astonished at seeing a path made by some object profusely bleeding having been dragged along the wall toward the well. Looking into the well nothing could be seen save great clots of blood on the brick walls that spoke this tale of foul play and the victims now lay at the bottom still in death. Next they looked into the slightly opened door and two great pools of blood had congealed on the floor. Aid was summoned and grappling hooks let into the well when some object was seized and brought to the surface which proved to be the body of Ton Tin Law. The body came up feet foremost as the well is so small, that the body of the man could not turn other wise. The grappling hooks in a like manner brought to the surface the body of the other victim. Ghastly wounds as of an axe had opened the skull of each in several places and violent blows had mutilated the face in several places while the throat of each was cut from ear to ear. The bodies were carried inside the house and a glance at the contents of the house were all that was needed to tell the tale of robbery and murder. In the bedroom of Gee Lee was found the murderous axe covered with the victims blood, carried there to break open the till containing his valuables everything locked was broken open and pilfered and left as the murderers had been in great haste. In the kitchen part where the deed was committed the clothes hung to dry not being high enough for a man to pass under without stooping was spattered with the victims blood. The position of the cloths seem to indicate that there had been a call at the rear door and that one of the chinamen had answered and opened the door and was brained on the spot when the other perhaps bearing the affair came inside and likewise brained and then mutilated. The deed must have been without any resistance on the part of the victims as not the slightest evidence of a struggle appears. Nothing is disarranged save by the murderers' hands, and the pools of blood not over six feet apart seem to point to the fact that the victims perished in the manner suggested. Among the contents of one of the tills broken open the coroner's jury found several checks for money, two of which were on the bank at Independence for the sums of \$200 and \$60 respectively, while another was on Laid & Tilton of Portland for \$170, and a \$20 bill was undisturbed, probably overlooked by the robbers in their haste. The sack in which the spare cash was kept was emptied and everything of value taken. The coroner's jury found that the Chinamen came to their death by acts of murder done by a party or parties unknown.

Salem Statesman: The Albany Herald on January 1 published an illustrated New Year's edition of twelve pages, the most extensive and enterprising piece of newspaper work ever done in Linn county. It might be added that the two papers above mentioned and the Herald are the only daily newspapers in Oregon which furnished their readers with an illustrated New Year's issue, reflecting the growth and improvements made during the year.

Slight Fire at the College.

Yesterday morning a small fire occurred at the college. A blaze started in the wood box, and burned a part of the wainscoting and destroyed one window. No alarm was sounded, as the fire was quickly extinguished by the students. The damage was nominal.
