A DECIDED CALL FOR IT.

The necessity of sending small sums by mail is felt by almost every person in the community. The postal note, although a great convenience, does not meet all the requirements of the case, as they are not always available. A large majority of the people of the country are decidedly in favor of a return to the fractional currency.

We agree with the writer who says: "Why give us one fourth of a cent's worth of paper rather than fifty cent's worth of silver?" asks a correspondent who objects to our advocacy of fractional currency, because he wants the currency to represent its value, whether it be ten cents or \$10. We advocate a re-issue of paper fractional currency as a convenience to millions of our people who are now restrained from using the mails because of the inconvenience or expense of sending money by mail.

The way of railroad managers is past finding out, until their arbitrary action has passed into history and become a recorded fact. For instance, the Pacific railroads under control of the Southern Pacific, and indeed all of those centering in California, in order to stimulate more travel to the coast, reduced their rates, concluding that even a financial deficit could be overbalanced by the benefits and increased business of a large immigration.

As immense tidal wave one night last week swept in upon the city of Portland, Maine, from the light house keeper's description apparently desiring to engulf the whole city. It finally satiated its fury by hurling itself sixty feet above the high-water mark against the engine, boiler and fog-horn house of the lighthouse.

REPRESENTATIVE THOMPSON, of California, has introduced a bill

into congress to remove the forest lands from being subject to entry or sale, and establish a commission to protect and conserve them. The object of this measure, it is stated, is to provide a reasonable and honorable means of conducting the land, bark and timber business in California and to maintain a permanent supply of fuel, to secure the climate against extreme of heat and cold and violent winds and to protect the valleys from torrents and floods, also the water-sheds of the springs and streams so that they shall remain perennial in their flow for the use of the mines, commerce and agriculture of the state.

GLADSTONE has ceased felling trees on his estate and gone to Italy for a rest. Probably the barter in chips of his making will still continue, however.
