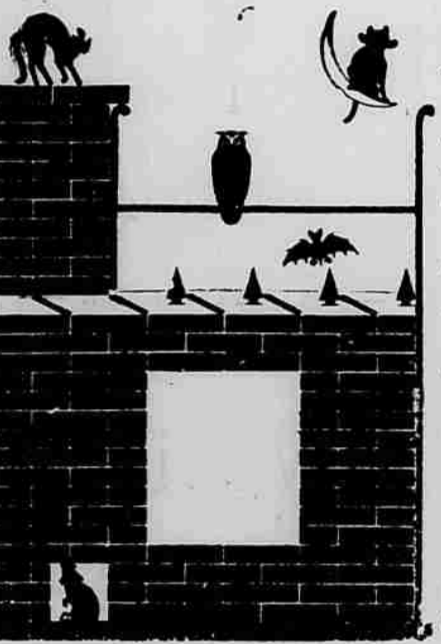

Democratic State Central Committee Meet in Portland.

DEMOCRATS GO TO PENDELTON.

Big Fire in Sheridan—Heavy Loss—Fremont Honored—Man Drowned at San Diego.

The Herald's Special Dispatch: PORTLAND, Jan. 11.—The democratic state central committee met here to-day. Twenty-two counties were represented. The committee fixed the basis of apportionment, and recommended primaries to be held March 22. Pendleton was selected as the place for holding the state convention, and the date fixed for Tuesday, April 3.

SHERIDAN BLAZE.

Whole side of Main Street Burned to the Ground.

SHERIDAN (Or.), Jan. 11.—All the buildings on the north side of Main street west of the bridge were burned this morning. The heaviest losers are R. McKune, H. F. Mayer, R. N. Snell, C. L. Worthington, Masonic hall and J. F. Bewley. Nearly all the goods were saved in a damaged condition, except those of Mr. Worthington, which were an entire loss. Ten houses in all were burned. The damage on both buildings and goods was very light.

Reception to Fremont.

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 11.—At this afternoon's meeting of the leading citizens, Mayor Workman presiding, it was resolved to tender General Fremont a reception Jan. 21, his 75th birthday, and in deference to his well known wishes on such occasion it was decided to make the affair as unobtrusive as possible. There will be no banquet. Lizard's avilion or army hall will be selected as the place for receiving citizen's congratulations.

Stumbled to His Death.

SAN DIEGO, Jan. 11.—A drowning accident occurred at the wharf of National City last evening. Alex Stuart, steward of the ship T. Oakes, left the boat with Boatman Fletcher, and after reaching the wharf Stuart walked about fifteen steps when he stumbled over a water pipe and into the bay. Fletcher threw two railroad ties into the water, but nothing has since been seen of Stuart, though men have been diving for the body his afternoon.
