PRESENCE OF MIND.

CONTAGIOUS DISEASES.

Just at present the smallpox is very prevalent in different sections of this coast and there exists great danger of its prevailing even our own city.

We understand that a case of smallpox was discovered in one of the immigrants that recently passed through here, and the car was sidetracked at Red Bluffs, where the California authorities have an efficient corps of examiners to quarantine infectious diseases.

As will be seen by the recent council proceedings, our city council are at work upon regulations to cover this danger, and evince careful prudent wisdom in the course they are pursuing.

In adopting measures, however, the principles of humanity should be preserved. The Alta mentions a case where a young lady in Oakland, and inmate of her father's house, was threatened with forcible removal to the p. house.
