DOCTRINE OF ANARCHY.

The shooting of Louise Michel, the female leader of the French anarchists, by Lucas, brings out a prominent phase of anarchist doctrine that, in this instance at least, probably will not be adhered to by them. Lucas claimed that he killed the anarchist queen to rid France of that dangerous party, and that her death would break up the entire anarchist organization in France. It is said that the anarchists themselves can have no right to complain of such a practical application of their own doctrine. They recognize to the fullest extent the principle of individual liberty, and put the most implicit confidence in the soundness of individual judgment and opinion. When a nihilist has once made up his mind that it is his duty to kill the czar for the sake of Russia, he finds none of his fellow-nihilists to say him nay. When a dynamite bomb is loaded in Chicago and thrown into a crowd, if the assassin is caught, tried and hanged the anarchist press do not speak of him as a murderer, but eulogize him as a martyr who laid down his life in defense of a principle, and was ruthlessly slaughtered for daring to maintain the doctrine of individual liberty.

Undoubtedly, however, they will be the loudest in their cries for a speedy execution of the perpetrator of the deed. Their philosophy contains no recognition of the axiom that what is sauce for the gander is also applicable as nutriment for the goose. No, indeed, self is too important for any such admission as that.

In the matter of industrial exhibitions, it is found that investments are profitable, and the president's recommendation to congress that the United States should accept the invitation of the French government to take part in the Paris exhibition of 1889 will doubtless receive the favorable action which it deserves. It becomes all republics, and most of all our own country, to lend a helping hand on this occasion, inasmuch as every monarchical government in Europe has sent a polite "regret." Switzerland, Mexico, and most of the Spanish-American republics have already accepted their invitation. The action of the monarchical countries is of course easily explicable. There is an awkwardness about the date, 1889, the centennial of the famous 1789, that cannot be gotten over. To be sure, the French government have several times explained in the most civil and positive manner that the selection of 1889 as the year of the exhibition was merely an accident, or, at least, was without reference to what happened in Paris one hundred years before; and, moreover, assurances have been given that the coming exhibition is to be purely a mercantile affair, having no political, much less any revolutionary, significance. Apart from patriotic and fraternal considerations, there is another reason why the United States should take an active part in the approaching exhibition. The Spanish-American republics, as has been said, are to be represented, and it is possible that an opportunity might thus be afforded, in the absence of our commercial rivals, England and Germany, and under the more favorable commercial conditions following a reform in our tariff laws, to increase our trade with these republics.

The pugilistic mania seems to be spreading and has invaded even the kitchen. Lately in Cleveland, Ohio, a cook named Jennie Kellis, employed by Mrs. Squire, wife of the secretary of the Standard oil company, took offense at some directions her mistress gave her and seized the lady by the hair, dragging her across the room, and, according to Queensbury rules, we suppose, pummeling her head on the floor. Wonderful muscular science. Perhaps some Fox will award the cook a champion diamond belt.

SENATOR DOLPH has apparently made the move in the right direction in the matter of coast defense

as late dispatches say that his bill to provide for fortifications and other sea coast defenses, which appropriates over \$126,000,000 within the next twelve years for proper sea coast defenses, was sent by him to the Secretary of War, who has returned it to Senator Dolph, with the approval of the Chief of Engineers of the War Department, and also with the approval of the secretary himself.

Gov. SWINEFORD, it is reported, will resign his position as governor of Alaska. The laws up there are not sufficiently strong to stand the rigors of the climate, and he proposes to return to more genial climes and let the sea-lions and Indians work out their own salvation.

SENATOR DOLPH has introduced a bill in the senate setting apart four townships of land in the vicinity of Crater lake as a public park. The object is to preserve the land adjacent to the lake for improvement by the state of Oregon.

The people of Dakota appear to be complicating matters in reference to the admission of the territory as a state, by attempting to get it divided and admitted as two states—North and South Dakota.
