COAST NOTES.

Newspapers Gathered From Exchanges Throughout the Northwest.

Another Chinese laundry will be added to the business houses of Monmouth. The two recent murders there do not seem to have terrified the heathens very much.

An old gentleman named Nathman, aged about 78 years, died Thursday morning at the residence of his son, B. A. Nathman, of Gervais, of blood-poisoning. The funeral took place from Gervais Friday.

Joseph exchange: The last reports from the Tunneling Company's mine were that the work was progressing finely. It is the intention of the company to work three shifts of miners in the tunnel after a few days.

Near Crawfordville, Linn county a few days ago, Sylvester Cochran killed a large cougar while out hunting deer. He saw a deer lying down, and was just in the act of shooting it when the cougar jumped out of a tree on to the deer.

James Brown raised eighteen acres of broom corn in Goose lake valley this season, and while the corn is not so long as can be grown where the seasons are longer it is of good quality. The corn was raised nearly 5000 feet above the level of the sea.

Milton Eagle: All the wheat has been shipped from the Milton warehouses. E. C. Walker has shipped this season for the Portland Shipping Company alone 117,000 bushels. The total amount shipped from this depot has been 73,000 sacks. This is no exaggeration, the figures being official.
