The price of wheat remains unchanged, and there is little activity in local markets or those abroad.

Apples—Green, 75c@21 per bu. Plums—Dried, 9@10c. per lb. Apples dried—bleached 9c sundried 7@8c. Chickens—Old \$2.50; young, \$2.50. Hides—Beef hides, green, 5c, dried 10c; deer skins, 20c; sheep pelts, 10@20c, according to wool.

Beef 2 1/2c gross. Mutton—\$2.50 per head. Hogs—6c, dressed.

PORTLAND MARKETS. WHEAT—No Walla Walla coming just now. It is thought the road will be clear before the week is out, when some delayed trains will come in. Valley is in light receipt. The present condition of the market is anything but satisfactory to all hands. Values cannot be closely quoted. Early advices were of decided weakness, the markets on this side closing some better.

OATS—The bulk of receipts go to San Francisco, the local market showing no change and needs continuing light.

POTATOES—Receipts are soon expected to show some increase, but the shipping market will hardly do much for holders.

EGGS—The light receipt is something of a surprise and the market holds up well.
