Considerable is being done in the local wheat market, but prices unchanged. ALBANY QUOTATIONS. Wheat—64.00 @ 65.00. Oats—30.00 @ 40.00. Flour—\$5 per bbl. Potatoes—65c. Eggs—25c. Butter—25c. Lard—20c @ 25c. Wool—10c @ 11c. Shoulders—60c. Bacon—11c @ 12c. Hay—Timothy, \$20, oats and chert, \$14. Apples—Green, 75c @ \$1 per bu. Plums—Dried, 9c @ 10c per lb. Apples dried—bleached, 7c sundried 7 @ 8c. Chickens—Old \$3.50; young, \$2.50. Hides—Beef hides, green, 5c, dried 10c; deer skins, 20c; sheep pelts, 10c @ 20c, according to wool. Beef 2 1/2c gross. Mutton—\$2.50 per head. Hogs—6c, dressed. PORTLAND MARKETS. WHEAT—Only a light movement. The valley section is sending little life forward, while receipts so far from the eastern section furnish no clue as to what they will be in the near future. The market is largely in a waiting state and only nominally quoted \$1.14 @ \$1.15 and \$1.25. New York and Chicago are again off 1/2 @ 3/4c. Beer-bottle canning dull markets. OATS—Some in by river boat. The market shows no disposition to soon work out of the dull state into which it has fallen. EGGS—Sales up to 40c. It is thought the high prices will soon be at an end. WOOL—Market somewhat excited and the high expectations of a year ago likely to rule again, on about as firm a foundation as they had then.
