Considerable is being done in the local wheat market, but prices unchanged. ALBANY QUOTATIONS. Wheat—64.00 per bu. Oats—39.00 per bu. Flour—\$5 per bbl. Potatoes—15c. Eggs—25c. Butter—25c. Lard—10c per lb. Wool—22c per lb. Hams—10c per lb. Shoulders—10c per lb. Bacon—11c per lb. Hay—Timothy, \$29, oats and wheat, \$11. Apples—Green, 75c per bu. Pears—Dried, 90c per bu. Apples dried—bleached 9c sundried 7c 8c. Chickens—Old \$3.50, young, \$2.50. Hides—Beef hides, green, 5c, dried 10c; deer skins, 20c; sheep pelts, 10c, 30c, according to wool. Beef 2 1/2c gross. Mutton—\$2.50 per head. Hogs—6c, dressed. PORTLAND MARKETS. WHEAT—Only a light movement. The valley section is sending little life forward while receipts so far from the eastern section furnish no clue as to what they will be in the near future. The market is largely in a waiting state and only nominally quoted \$1.14 and \$1.15. New York and Chicago are again off 1/2c. Beer, both cabling dull markets. OATS—Some in by river boat. The market shows no disposition to soon work out of the dull state into which it has fallen. EGGS—Sales up to 46c. It is thought the high prices will soon be at an end. WOOL—Market somewhat excited and the high expectations of a year ago likely to be again, on about as slim a foundation as they had then.
