Considerable is being done in the local wheat market, but prices unchanged.

Apples—Green, 75c @ 81 per bu. Plums—Dried, 90c @ 1.00 per bu. Apples dried—bleached 9c. un-dried 7 @ 8c. Chickens—Old \$3.50; young, \$2.50. Hides—Blue, 10c; Green, 8c, dried 10c; Deer skins, 20c; sheep pelts, 10@20c, according to wool.

Beef—4 1/2c gross. Mutton—\$2.50 per head. Hogs—4c, dressed. PORTLAND MARKETS. WHEAT.—Cables report a firm market abroad with rather more inquiry for cargoes, and an advance of 1/4 cent per quarter over last week's prices. Eastern and coast option markets show a steady decline.

The market is largely in a waiting state and only nominally quoted \$1.34 @ \$1.35 and \$1.25. New York and Chicago are again off 1/2 @ 3/4c. Bur-bohm cabling dull markets.

POTATOES.—Fair amount of activity, receipts by wagon being large. EGGS.—Quote 25c.

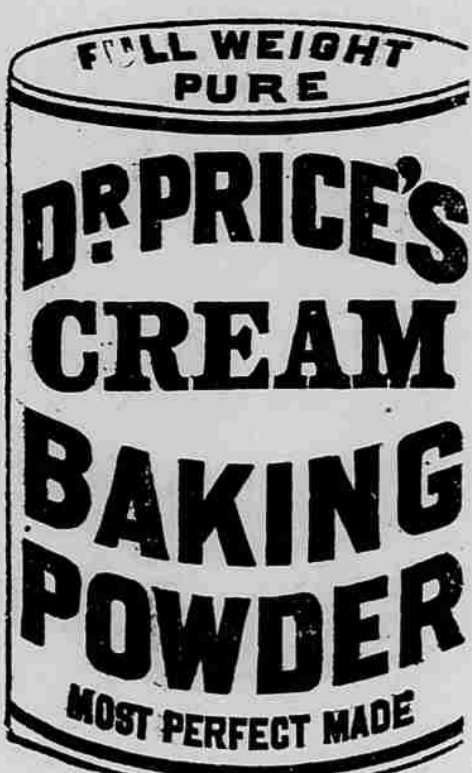

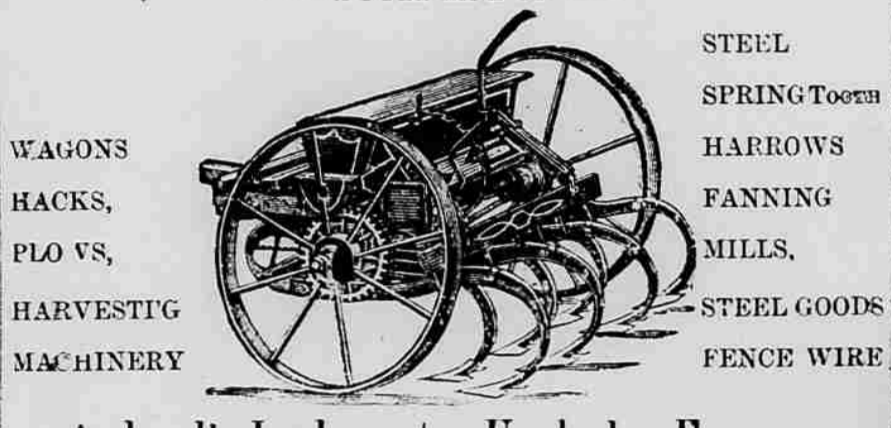
