POTATOES—Fair amount of activity, receipts by wagon being large.

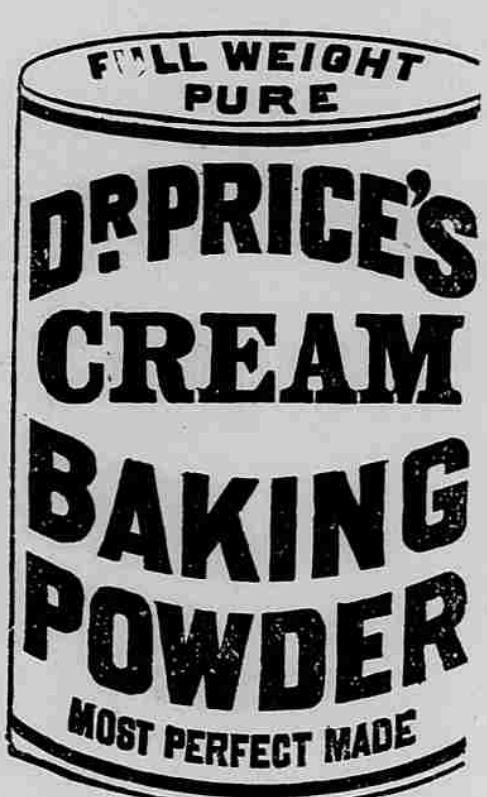

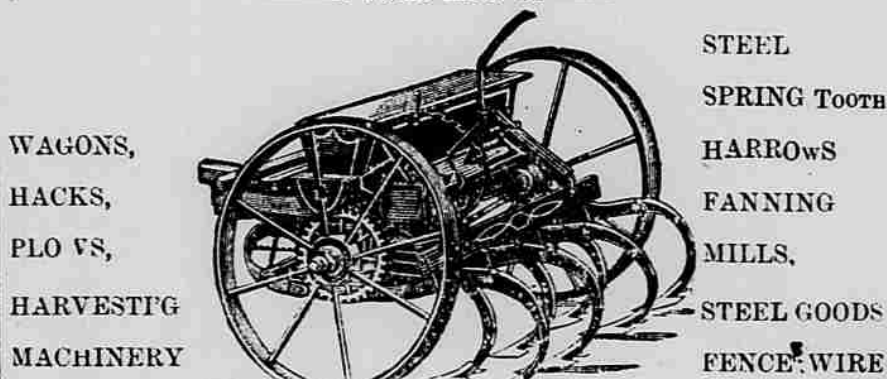

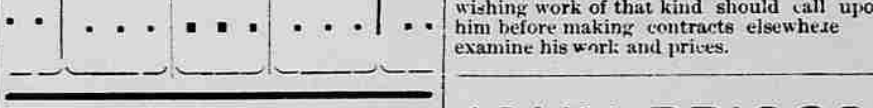
