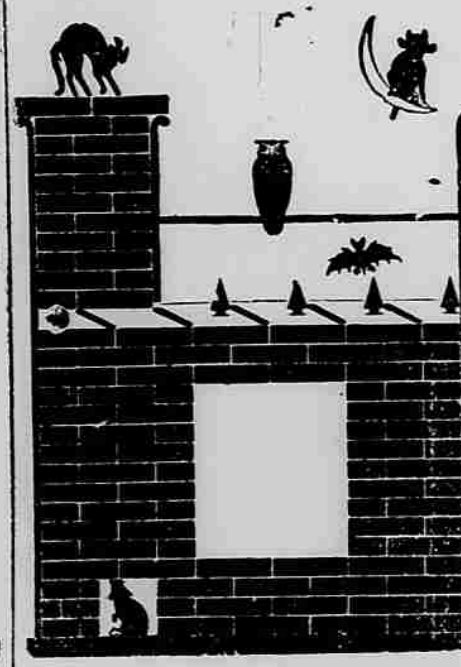

James F. McLaughlin, an electrician, was in the Girard House last night, and entertained a group of friends with stories of wonderful results attained in electrical science and more wonderful results that are yet to be attained.

In speaking of Governor Hill's recent message on capital executions, he told several suggestions made by electricians for dispatching murderers by appliances, and then switched on the subject of a new invention for signaling during time of war.

"Briefly, the scheme is this," he said. "The scouts or signal officers carry in their knapsacks six small incandescent lights of different primary colors. These are connected by a very fine wire with a small battery in the knapsack. Attached to the small globes that enclose the lights is a very small oval electric motor, operated by an independent battery. When one scout wishes to communicate with another he sends one globe high into the air and then turns on the electric fluid that illuminates it. By the use of different colored globes and by combinations a conversation of any length can be carried on at night at long distances. The invention will be patented in Europe, and an effort will be made to introduce it into the different European armies, as well as into the alleged army in this country."

## THE STRIKE

The Trouble Still Continues Among the striking Engineers

PITTSBURG, Feb. 29.—The Knights of Labor engineers have clearly outlined their policy. According to an interview with one of the engineers they will not take the places of the Burlington strikers, and will promise Chief Arthur, of the brotherhood to return to their homes if he calls his engineers off the Reading & Brooklyn Elevated Railway. Five carloads of engineers passed through this city this morning en route for Chicago. There were 200 in one party, and they were nearly all Knights of Labor and mostly former employees of the Reading railroad.

## CORCORAN'S WILL

The Wealthy Philanthropist's Estate Valued at Three Million.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 29.—The will of the late W. W. Corcoran was offered for probate to-day. The greater portion of the estate, which is valued at \$3,000,000, is bequeathed to his grand-children Geo. P. Louis, M. and W. C. Eustis, to be held in trust for them for ten years. Several legacies of \$5000 are left to other relations, and similar amounts to various orphan asylums, \$100,000 was left to the Corcoran art gallery, and \$50,000 to Louise home for aged women, \$50,000 having already been devoted to it.

## DID NOT LIKE MUSIC

A Newly Married Woman Mortally Wounded a Serenader

St. Louis, Feb. 28.—Wilson Arnold, of Appleton City, Mo., married a young widow at Kansas City last Monday. Last evening a party of friends assembled at his home with brass and string instruments to give them a serenade. Mrs. Arnold appeared on the porch armed with a revolver, and ordered the party to desist and leave the place. They did not appear inclined to go, and she fired three shots into the crowd. Homer Haverland, aged 16, was shot through the body and mortally wounded. Then the serenaders retired. There is much indignation in the community at Mrs. Arnold's act and a serious feud is feared as a result.

## GOULD WILL GO FREE

New York, Feb. 29.—It is understood on good authority that the grand jury decided yesterday by a vote of 18 to 5 to find no indictment against Jay Gould and Russell Sage. The merits of the case and question of the guilt or innocence of Gould and Sage were considered, but simply the probability of their prosecution was abandoned by lapse of time.
