FRACTIONAL SILVER CERTIFICATES.

The lower house of congress has passed a bill authorizing the issuance of fractional silver certificates in the denominations of ten, fifteen and twenty-five cents. Undoubtedly the action was taken in response to the expressed wish of the people for the re-issue of the old fractional currency. The vote upon the bill indicates this, as it was unusually large, being 178 to 67, that a very largely expressed desire from the country for a fractional currency must have reached congress.

In the past the citizens of this coast have strenuously objected to anything but "coin" as a circulating medium. But the convenience of paper money in business transactions has entirely changed the views upon that subject, and now the greenback or national bank note is just as eagerly sought after as gold or silver. There certainly can be no objection to this silver certificate issue, as the silver itself as a foundation for its redemption remains in the treasury vaults, and therefore there is no more danger of depreciation of the fractional certificates than there would be to the silver itself. In fact, there will not be as much danger of depreciation in the certificates as with the silver coin, for the trouble of carrying around a few dollars in change will not attach so readily to the certificates as to the coin, and people will not object to receiving it on that account.

The convenience of the fractional currency in business transactions will be innumerable. More especially will its convenience become apparent in the remitting of small sums through the mail. It is not always convenient to obtain a postal note, and the fractional currency will save the trouble and expense, and it can be sent from offices that are not post-office or order offices.

Exo, the first of the defaulting bank officials to emigrate to Canada, and whose defalcations were made up by his father, is talking of returning to his home in New York. Possibly it would be healthful for him to remain in Canada until the limit of the law's application in his case expires. Some person may conclude to prosecute, even if the father did pay back the money. The criminal part of the business still remains.
