Linn County Republican Convention

A republican convention for Linn county is hereby called to meet at the court house in Albany on April 4th at 10 a. m. for the purpose of electing delegates to the state republican convention, which convenes in Portland April 11th, and for the purpose of placing in nomination candidates for the various county offices, and to transact such other business as may properly come before the convention.

EDITORIAL NOTES.
