Linn County Republican Convention

A republican convention for Linn county is hereby called to meet at the court house in Albany on April 4th at 10 A. M. for the purpose of electing delegates to the state republican convention, which convenes in Portland April 11th, and for the purpose of placing in nomination candidates for the various county offices, and to transact such other business as may properly come before the convention.

The committee recommend that the primaries be held on March 31st, at 2 P. M. S. S. TRAM, G. W. DAVIS, Sec. Chairman.

ONE ITEM OF NATIONAL WEALTH.

TEMPERANCE NOTES.

Since the closing of the wholesale liquor houses in Sioux City, Iowa, the criminal docket has been utterly devoid of interest, the number of arrests having fallen off one hundred and thirteen in one month, and the "revenues" to magistrates and court officials decreased over one-half in thirty days.

Prof. Winship, of the New England Journal, says of the Blair educational bill now before congress: "The sentiments of the superintendents of schools was almost solidly in its favor; the opinion of the educators of the country is almost a unit in its favor." We are glad to note Oregon's representative is in the fore in this important matter.

The speech of Walter T. Mills, the Phil Sheridan of the prohibition army, on last Tuesday was a masterpiece, full of logic, common sense, and sparkling with rare wit. As a platform speaker, Mr. Mills has few equals, and as a political thinker and reasoner, he has both breadth and depth.

On last Monday evening a few of our citizens were highly entertained at the W. C. T. U. hall by Dr. A. J. Judkins, corresponding secretary of the national prohibition committee of Chicago. The Dr. is an eminent divine and a most entertaining platform speaker.

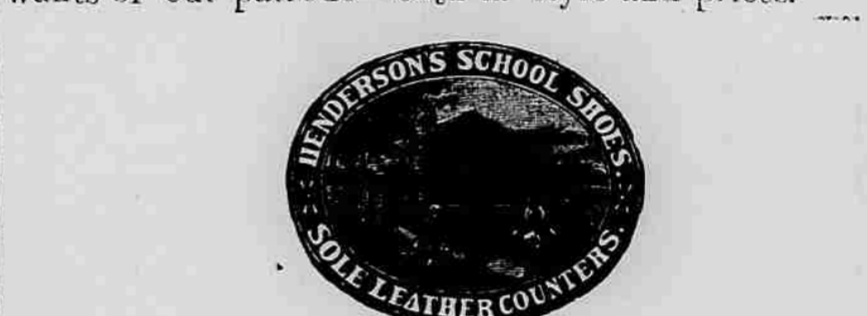
