VILAS AND THE SURPLUS.

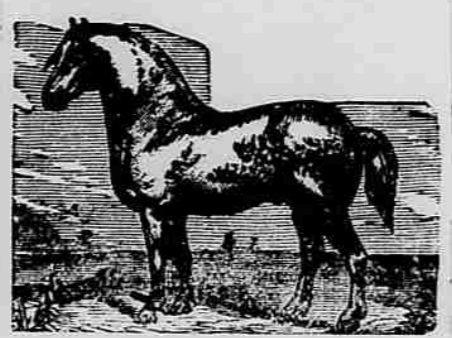
