ANNUAL MEETING OF THE W. C. T. U.

Last Tuesday the annual reports of the officers and superintendents of the W. C. T. U. were presented.

The secretary's report showed the number of active, paying members to be 69; number of regular meetings held, 29; special, 10; public, 10; largest attendance at any regular meeting, 29; smallest, 9; average, 17.

The treasurer reported of moneys having passed through her hands, \$437.96; disbursements, \$41.66; balance in treasury, \$34.06.

The superintendent of literature reported that 16,000 pages of literature had been distributed during the year.
