THE PUBLIC DEBT AND THE SURPLUS.

The bond purchase bill in its prolonged discussion is likely to bring numerous facts which are of interest to the general reader. The amount of the actual surplus in the treasury is one of these facts, and Reagan's amendment, when it is reached, which calls for the \$100,000,000 of gold coin kept in the treasury as a special reserve fund to be used in purchasing bonds, will call attention to the various funds lying idle there.

In referring to Alaskan affairs the West Shore calls attention to the fact that Governor Swineford, of Alaska, has made a report showing the Alaska Fur Seal Company in an unenviable light. He says it is a concern that has grown enormously rich from its monopoly, and has grown arrogant and tyrannical.

At the republican state convention, which meets in Portland to-day, the business is likely to be done quietly and without any wrangling. It is quite certain that Hermann will be re-nominated. The other offices are few and abundant good material is available to complete the ticket.

Roscoe Conkling, the once powerful leader of the republicans in congress is dying at his home in New York.

The session of congress is drawing to a close, and the democrats have done nothing to avert the dire disaster predicted by Cleveland in December last. The passage of the bond purchase act is simply a work of supererogation. Had the administration been desirous of relieving the surplus by paying off the national debt, it could have done so without further authority. The act in its present shape is merely a declaration that there is a law in force, and amounts virtually to a rebuke to Cleveland's treasurer, who has refused to avail himself of the undoubted authority conferred upon him to buy bonds whenever there is a surplus in the treasury.

STATISTICS show that the national debts of Europe have been increased by the amount of \$40,000,000,000 since 1870, and there is an evident disposition in some quarters to swell the sum still further. If there fails to be a smash in the not very remote future it will not be due to the fact that kings, princelings, etc., of the old world are not doing all in their power to bring about such a calamity, and all under a beautiful free trade reign, too!

St. John, who is haranguing his third party brethren on his old hobby of four years ago, will be here to-morrow. His coming promises to beautifully diminish the number of prohibition votes in Linn county in the coming election, as sincere temperance people place very little confidence in the demagogism of such hirelings as St. John.

PRESIDENT CARNOT, of the French republic, manages to squeeze along and make both ends meet on a salary of \$20,000 per month. He can afford to accept a little personal abuse on that amount of pay.

THE HERALD suggests that a meeting should be called to organize a board of trade. The matter ought not be delayed any longer.
