THE BUSINESS OUTLOOK.

Although just at present the political agitation of the country, together with the usual lethargy concomitant with that period of the year when the indolence of spring is giving place to the active summer season, has conspired to make business a trifle quiet, there is every indication that business and trade which has been steadily increasing throughout Oregon during the past year will be even better during the coming season.

Our neighbors in California, who, during the past year or two, have been enjoying a wonderful boom complain that the bubble has broken and that things are assuming their normal condition again, while the tendency of speculators and those looking for investments is now toward Oregon. This tendency, coupled with the number of Eastern people who, after the blizzard of last winter, will be looking for homes in the salubrious West, will bring an unusually large influx of new-comers to Oregon this year. In addition to this the people of Oregon are putting forth more vigorous efforts than ever before to bring the advantages of the state to the notice of Eastern men, in the way of advertising matter and descriptive publications.

Albany there are several considerations, which, in the light of this movement toward Oregon, present themselves to business men. The two paramount considerations are: 1. Shall Albany take any measures to secure a share of this influx of new-comers? 2. What means can be adopted for employment to those who come here?

Albany has already done a little in the way of advertising the advantages of the city, but a very little. There seems to be a general want of sentiment in the matter of organizing a board of trade and taking steps to do a little mission-ary work among intending emigrants in the East, and this will not do.

When comes the important matter of inducing some enterprise here which will offer employment to create new business. Albany unsurpassed water power and cements for manufacturing, it is in this line we believe in great measure that permanent prosperity must come. With a little of trade to look after such things, the establishing of new enterprises of this kind would be likely to be accomplished.

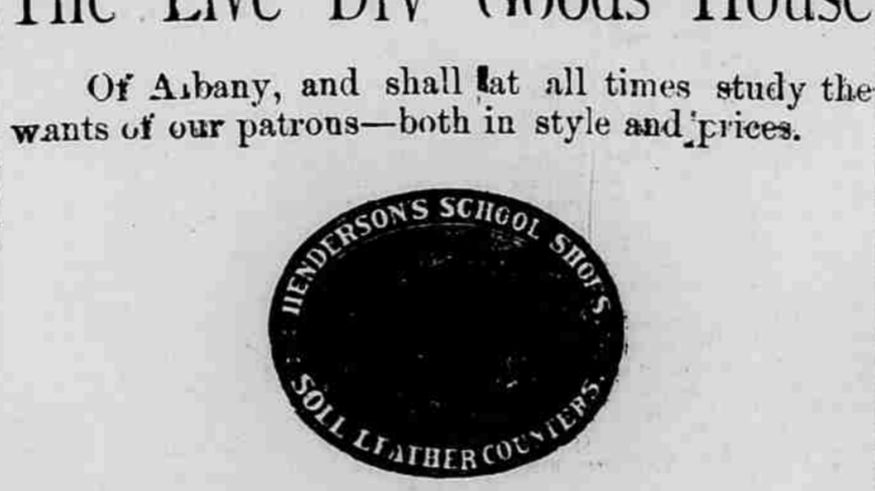
