A BOARD OF TRADE.

TEMPERANCE NOTES.

The annual state convention of the women's christian temperance union will be held in Eugene, City May 9th. Each local unit is a representation of one delegate at large, one for every two members and one for a fraction over ten.

The national bureau of statistics shows that on the 700,000,000 which annually passes into the tills of the retailers of intoxicating liquors in this country, there is a profit of 133 1/4 per cent. If the poor people had to pay such a tax as that on bread there would be a rebellion.
