## GENERAL NEWS.

**The President Appoints Melville W. Fuller Chief Justice.**

**A HUSBAND'S INHUMAN CRIME.**

**A Mother Beaten to Death While Defending Her Child—Fatal Railway Disaster—Steamship Sinks.**

**WASHINGTON, April 30.**—The president has sent to the senate the nomination of Melville W. Fuller, of Illinois, to be chief justice of the United States supreme court.

**The Emperor Better.**

**BERLIN, April 30.**—The emperor passed a quiet night, the fever has almost entirely subsided. His general condition is unchanged.

**The Pope's Excess Condemned.**

**LONDON, April 30.**—A meeting composed of Irishmen and Englishmen, which was held at Landor-street, condemned the Pope's decree, and resolved to found a branch of home rule organization, and to cease our efforts to Peters Pense.

**ANOTHER RAILWAY HORROR.**

**A Train Plunges Down an Embankment and Injures Many.**

**OLAN, N. Y., April 30.**—The passenger train on the New York & Pennsylvania railroad was wrecked near Whitehouse, ten miles east of here this morning by the spreading of the rails. The mail and baggage cars, and two passenger coaches containing about forty passengers, rolled twenty feet down an embankment. No one was killed outright, but seven of those injured will die.

**STEAMSHIP GOES DOWN.**

**The Queen of the Pacific Sinks at San Luis Obispo.**

**SAN LUIS OBISPO, April 30.**—The steamship Queen of the Pacific arrived off Port Harford at 6:30 this morning her hold full of water having sprung a leak about 2:30 P. M. Although having powerful pumps working the water gained rapidly and the vessel sank in twenty feet of water, and is at present lying east, resting on the bottom two hundred yards from the wharf. The Queen of the Pacific is one of the finest vessels of the Pacific Coast.

**A FRIENDSHIP CRIME.**

**A Wife Murdered by Her Husband While Protecting Her Daughter.**

**CHICAGO, April 30.**—While defending the life of her thirteen-year-old step-daughter against the fendishness of her unnatural father, Mrs. Mullberg was struck down with murderous intent by her husband at a late hour last night and is now dying. Mullberg got to his home on Law avenue in an intoxicated condition. He went directly to the room where his three children lay sleeping and attempted an assault on his daughter. The children screamed for aid and Mullberg's wife ran in from the next room. The brute was beating the child about the head to silence her cries and when his wife endeavored to stop him he turned and dealt her two blows, which cut her shoulder and her face. She made several attempts to get to the door and call for aid, but was prevented by her husband beating her. In the meantime all the children escaped from bed and endeavored to stay their cruel father's wrath. Mrs. Mullberg at last succeeded in reaching the steps where she managed with superhuman strength to cry for help. Mullberg then shook the children from him and took a small crowbar from a tool chest and struck the woman over the head, crushing in her skull. Then for the first time he appeared to realize what he had done. He entreated the children not to tell who did the deed, and then taking some money he fled. The police were notified, but up to the present time the murderer has not been apprehended.

**A ROW IN ITAH.**

**The Mormons Trying to Run the Democratic Party.**

**SALT LAKE CITY, April 28.**—The democratic county convention at Provo was invaded to day by Mormons, who voted resolutions declaring against participation by members of the people's (church) party, and against the admission of the church and the body of democrats thereupon withdrew, and the democrats held a meeting and passed the resolutions voted down by the Mormons, and selected delegates to the territorial convention. The Mormons also continued their meeting, and selected another set of delegates.
