TEACHERS' INSTITUTE.

Proceedings of the Teachers' Institute of District No. 2, at Tangent.

FORENOON SESSION. The institute was called to order by Mr. Herron, and in the absence of the regular officers H. W. Herron was chosen chairman and W. A. McGhee secretary.

Mr. Hunt said that a teacher should tell the class what lies before them and how to study the lesson. W. A. McGhee said his method was to require the pupil to repeat what was read.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The Tangent band called the teachers together with excellent music. The enrollment showed the following teachers present: A. W. Moses, Tangent. H. W. Herron, Tangent.

Mr. Hunt spoke in favor of using objects freely in the first lessons until the pupils could count and combine numbers readily. Mr. Burt would also use objects, that being nature's way to teach counting.

A recess of a few minutes was taken, during which the Tangent brass band played several pieces. Upon motion of Mr. Hunt the subject of grading public schools was discussed by the institute, all the teachers speaking in favor of it.
