THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S SHIP.

H. H. Hewitt, the nominee for prosecuting attorney for the third judicial district on the republican ticket, is a Yambill boy through and through, and, therefore, is entitled to the largest majority with in the gift of the people. As a painstaking, conscientious attorney he has no superior; as a republican, tried and true; as a man and fellow citizen, worthy of the support of the whole state. It might also be added as an indication of Mr. Hewitt's popularity, that at the republican convention of Yambill county held Monday he was cordially endorsed. It is nothing new, however, to hear Mr. Hewitt spoken of as an able attorney, for the people of Linn county have long known him to be such, as well as one of our foremost citizens and in every way worthy of a large majority for the office of district attorney.

The claim of the Pendleton East Oregonian that it would lead to an early opening of the Columbia river to place the democratic party in full power, is not founded on any facts for support, for the present members of congress have used every possible effort to push the appropriations through for its opening. The pocket veto of the democratic president has had more to do with retarding the work than any other act. Wager had better choose some other topic.

The flagellation of Senator Voorhees by Senator Ingalls, over the war record of Senator Voorhees, seems to have had a salutatory effect, as strenuous efforts are being made to expunge the matter from the senate records with probable success, an action that will effectually close the bitter personal warfare that has heretofore been carried on against the Kansas senator. Ingalls seems to be shrewdly capable of taking care of himself.

The Democrat says that Ad Harmon swore to his exorbitant claim allowed by the county court. Several road supervisors also swore to their claims. Harmon's was allowed, but many supervisors' honest claims were cut down without even notifying them. The query is, does Judge Whitney consider Ad Harmon's oath better than those of the road supervisors of Linn county.

The people of Oregon want a congressman who will represent the whole state, and not a strictly Portland man. Hon. Binger Hermann has always been watchful of the interests of every section of the state, and will continue to do so after his re-election next June.

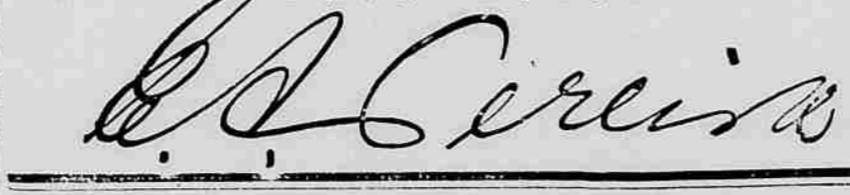
