THE canvass in Linn county will open to-morrow at Fox Valley.

TEMPERANCE NOTES.

At the regular meeting of the union Tuesday afternoon a lengthy and interesting report of the state convention was read by the president. A steel engraving of the proposed temperance temple, to be erected in Chicago, was presented to the union by Mother Fisher, who procured it by making up what is known as a "Baby Band."

In the recapitulation of the report of the superintendent of young women's work at the state convention, we find the following items of general interest: There are now twelve young woman's unions in the state; these have a total membership of 42, which represents 293 active and 149 honorary members.

The state convention voted to give special attention this year to gospel temperance, and if possible bring some noted worker in that line into the state and make a thorough canvass.
