## GENERAL NEWS.

Villard Will Be President of Oregon & Transcontinental.

NEW OREGON LAND DISTRICT.

The Maine Democratic State Convention—An Anarchist Released—New Railroad Enterprises.

The Herald's Special Dispatches.

New York, May 22.—At the annual meeting of the Oregon & Transcontinental company, June 18th, it is understood Henry Villard will be elected president of the company. An address will be issued to the stockholders in Villard's name in which he states that having rendered assistance to the company in a critical stage of its affairs, he now feels called upon to aid in securing more satisfactory results in the future for stockholders. For this purpose he says he has obtained a co-operation of the foreign capitalists which he represents, and his friends, in evidence of their intentions to infuse new life into the company, have already acquired a large interest in stock.

In conclusion he requests a co-operation of the stockholders in a proposed effort for the re-establishing of the Oregon & Transcontinental company.

## OHIO SUPREME COURT.

Decision Rendered in Important Cases Before the Tribunal.

COLUMBUS, Ohio, May 21.—The supreme court this morning granted a motion for leave to file a petition in error to Franklin county court of common pleas in the case of Allen O. Myers, sentenced to three months imprisonment for contempt of court, growing out of an article which he wrote during the progress of the tally sheet for the case. The court refused grant leave to file a petition in error to the circuit court, Portage county, in the case of Blinky Morgan, the Ravenna murderer, sentenced to be hanged June 1.

## AN ANARCHIST RELEASED.

He Only Served Six Weeks of His Sentence—An Appeal.

MILWAUKEE, May 22.—Paul Grattkan, an anarchist agitator, has been released from the house of correction after serving but six weeks of his sentence of one year's imprisonment, on account of a technicality. When the legislature held that a sentence for felonies should not begin to run until the prisoner was actually locked up, it did not mention misdemeanors, and consequently the time spent by Grattkan in jail pending appeal to the supreme court, will be applied on the original sentence. The district attorney will take the case to the supreme court.

## MAINE DEMOCRATS.

They Meet, and of Course Endorse President Cleveland's Actions.

AUGUSTA, May 22.—The democratic state convention met this morning and was called to order by S. S. Jones, chairman of the state committee. A. A. Powers was chosen chairman, and made a brief address, advocating the continuance of the administration of President Cleveland.

## Fine Horse Dead.

LENNINGTON, May 22.—J. H. Sherman, proprietor of the Sherman stock farm lost by pneumonia the five-year-old bay stallion Henry Wilkes, by George Wilkes. He was never campaigned, and was untried as a stallion, but the owner refused \$15,000 for him a short time before.

## Opposed to "Corners."

CHICAGO, May 22.—The board of trade adopted the amendment yesterday abolishing the rule prohibiting corners, by a large majority. This action is significant, local papers say for the reason that in May there might be a corner in corn, and that a corner in wheat might occur in July without surprising anybody.

## Railway Across Crow Reservation.

WASHINGTON, May 22.—Billings, Clarke's Fork and Cook city railroad company, having secured a right of way through the Crow reservation, will, it is said, commence the construction of a road at once with the expectation of completing nearly the entire road to Cook city this season.

## Canadian Affairs.

OTTAWA, May 22.—A Petition asking for the commutation of the capital sentence passed on Grandy and Rachette, murderers of McLeish the half-breed, has been considered by the governor in council. It decides that the law must take its course. The two men therefore will be hanged at Rigga next month.

## Murderer Maxwell.

St. Louis, May 22.—The court yesterday received a mandate from the United States supreme court in the case of Becker alias Maxwell. The court adjourned without fixing any date for the execution. It will not convene again until June 4.
