### GENERAL NEWS.

#### The St. Louis Convention Completes Its Work.

#### THURMAN TAKES SECOND PLACE

The Convention Reaffirms the Principles of 1884 and Adopts a "Cleveland Terrier" Platform.

St. Louis, June 7.—The democratic national convention was called to order at 10 A. M. to-day, and the chairman of the committee on resolutions read the platform, which had been unanimously adopted by the committee. It reaffirms the principles of the platform of 1884, and endorses the president's last letter to congress. A resolution was adopted, demanding the admittance to the union of the Northwest territories, also endorsing the Mills bill and its immediate passage by congress.

Tarpey, of California, nominated Thurman for the vice-presidency, and Voorhees in a strong speech nominated Gray. He said that without Indiana the democrats had no hope of carrying the election. When it was found that state after state demanded Thurman's nomination and would accept no compromise, the name of Gray was withdrawn and Thurman's nomination was made unanimous. The convention adjourned sine die at 2:15.
