### GENERAL NEWS.

#### Buildings Swept Away by a Freshet in Wisconsin.

Chinese En Route to San Francisco—General Sheridan Continues to Improve Emperor Frederick's Dyking.

#### SMUGGLING GOODS INTO OREGON

The Herald Special Dispatchers.] SEAFORTH (Wis.), June 14.—Several million feet of logs broke loose from the booms above Cloquet yesterday and swept down upon an island where several hundred people live. Two hotels, three saloons, four dwellings, court house, jail and a store were carried away. Thirty or forty buildings are now completely surrounded by water and most of them abandoned. The lumber yards here are flooded, and the St. Paul & Duluth railroad had to abandon their line to the Northern Peninsula.

#### THE EMPEROR'S CONDITION.

#### He Is Gradually Failing and is Slowly Dying.

POTSDAM, June 14.—Nourishment was repeatedly administered last night. He gained some strength, but there is a steady decline in his vital force which artificial food is unable to arrest. His temporary rallies are brief and delusive, and medical experts are of the opinion that the emperor will gradually die of exhaustion.

Empress Constance is here in attendance at the bedside of the emperor.

At 10 o'clock this morning a bulletin was issued stating that the emperor was much worse and his strength is gradually failing.

The crown prince and crown princess and Prince Henry have arrived at the castle.

Empress Victoria has watched at the bedside of the emperor since 4 o'clock this morning. All the imperial members of the family have been summoned to the bedside.

#### A SMUGGLER'S CONFESSION.

#### How Goods were Smuggled into Oregon and California.

INDIANAPOLIS, June 14.—Charles Labelle, an opium smuggler captured here Saturday, has confessed that he has been employed by Ontario parties since January to forward goods to California. The gang first began shipping direct to California, but afterwards they shipped to Oregon and successively through Victoria, Winnipeg and Ontario. Labelle claims he was ignorant of the fact that he was forwarding smuggled goods and engaged in criminal business. He had already forwarded six consignments successfully.

#### Vacancy Filled.

BERLIN, June 14.—The Emperor Frederick yesterday telegraphed to Bismarck to open negotiations with Count Zedeck Teulzsch, president of the province of Posen, to assume the office of minister of the interior of Prussia, to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Von Puttkamer.

#### Gen. Sheridan's Condition.

WASHINGTON, June 14.—Gen. Sheridan passed a very quiet and comfortable night, resting well and coughing but little. His pulse continues good. No unfavorable symptoms have appeared.

#### Chinese Going to Frisco.

VANCOUVER, B. C., June 14.—The Canadian Pacific steamer, Batavia, sailed for San Francisco this morning with 519 Chinese.

#### Baltimore, June 12.—The body of T. Harrison Garrett, who was drowned Thursday while on a yachting excursion, has been recovered.

#### CRAWFORDVILLE ITEMS.

All the farmers wear a broad smile in consequence of the fine rain, which insures good crops.

John Edwards and his young bride returned on last Thursday evening from their wedding tour to Washington Territory. They were given a charivari by the elite of the neighborhood, of which the groom is one.

Mr. A. C. Hausman has moved to his place one mile above this place, where he will engage in the dairy business.

A party of six of our young folks visited Sodaville and Waterloo on last Saturday. They report having a nice time, as they did not get back till quite late, and some people began to surmise that they might have gone to Albany.

A Kansas youth, who believed himself possessed of extraordinary mesmeric powers, tried to hypnotize his dog. The dog didn't take kindly to the process, and the enterprising genius now stands up to eat his pie.

An Indiana judge did not know what a cartoon was. A lawyer sketched the body of a jackass with his judge's head and face attached as a specimen and was promptly fined \$25 for contempt of court.

#### Interesting Phenomena at Sea.

The anchor liner Ancharia, just arrived in New York after a quick run, reports as follows: About 350 miles east of the American coast, and on the borders of the Gulf stream, the vessel passed through phenomena which, although frequent on a small scale, are extremely rare on such maximum grandeur of scale as that which enraptured the observers on the Ancharia. After the vessel had been running over twenty-four hours in a dense fog, the water around suddenly became so luminous that the mile-long shoals of small fish darting around the vessel seeking refuge from the sharks and other devouring enemies, gave the sea the appearance of a vast cauldron of boiling jewels, while the furrows of foam from the great ships were so gilded as to resemble masses of light violet flame as if ordered the smallest thread in the ship's rigging as clearly visible as a bright sunshine, and enveloped the vessel in such a mass of dazzling light violet-colored glare, that the engines had to be slowed a few hours until a storm of wind bursting out from the northeast, cleared off the fog and broke the whole visible surface of the ocean into flying crests of flame-like foam of such brilliancy that the whole ocean seemed ablaze with the heaving, flashing flame, the whole horizon line having the appearance of an immense belt of light blue fire. In short, the whole phenomenon was such an one as is rarely seen, the oldest and widest traveled seamen having never seen anything at all to compare with it. This beautiful pyrotechnic display of nature lasted from 11 p. m. until 3:30 p. m. until lost in the eclipsing light of dawn.

#### French Women and Strasburg.

General Boulanger repudiated to our representatives the other day, as a libel on the women of France, the remark, attributed to M. Grey, that "there was not a single mother in Bordeaux or Marseilles or elsewhere who would not send her son to die for the sake of restoring Strasburg to France." "We shall see," said the general, "who is right." Like a sensible man he is setting to work to fulfill his own expectation, if he can, and is going to distribute 2,500,000 free copies of his history of the war of 1870, in which a special appeal is made to the "grandmothers, mothers, wives, betrothed daughters and sisters" of France. It will be interesting to see whether the description of the massacre of the French sons in 1870 will increase the willingness of French mothers in 1888 to devote their sons afresh. One would have been inclined to think not. Verestchagin's pictures of war, one knows, were interdicted in Russia for their pacifist tendency. But General Boulanger's history is, perhaps, written in the school of romance rather than of realism.

#### Buried Plunder.

A day or two ago a negro boy, while strolling in the swamp adjoining the town of Chattanooga, Ga., happened to kick away a little dirt along the banks of the river, recently covered by water and mud washed by the recent overflow. To his surprise a shining gold watch was revealed. He kicked away a little more earth and another tinker made its appearance. He began to think he had unearthed an underground watch factory. He continued his digging, and the result of his find was four gold watches, valued at \$100 each, and two silver watches valued at \$25 each. It is supposed that some burglar, closely pursued, buried the watches there and then escaped to Florida.
