Bank of France cashed 23,300 notes of the counterfeit denomination. The modern Greeks seem to be reversing the order of the natural expansion of human action and greed. The story comes that it was rather a queer delation that occurred in the Greek treasury and it is said made a great sensation at Athens. It seems that 5,000,000 francs in bank notes more than the books called for were discovered. The chief cashier was the one at fault. He insisted the treasury was nearly empty, but the minister, Tricoujis, thought that could not be so, as there had been large collections for duties and taxes, and instituted an inquiry with the result mentioned. Most people with errors in their accounts have a deficiency instead of a surplus in cash. The doubt in the minds of the Greek officials probably is not as to what was found, but as to how much was not found that ought to have been.

and of these only one proved to be counterfeit. The whole number of counterfeits discovered was about seventy. The French government, as it had the legal right to do in order to allay the excitement and stop the run on the bank, required the latter to cash all notes presented, whether counterfeit or not. The justice of this requirement is founded on the principle that the bank, exercising the privilege of issuing notes, should either print them in a manner rendering it impossible to counterfeit them, or bear the loss that successful counterfeits inflict on an unsuspecting public. In this matter the bank and the public are equally innocent of the crime, but it is a maxim of law that where the loss must fall upon one of two innocent parties, it should fall on the one by whom the loss was rendered possible. The bank by exercising the privilege of issuing notes—which privilege is for its advantage—made it possible to impose on the public by counterfeiting the notes, and should therefore bear the loss. This principle is too much lost sight of in this country.

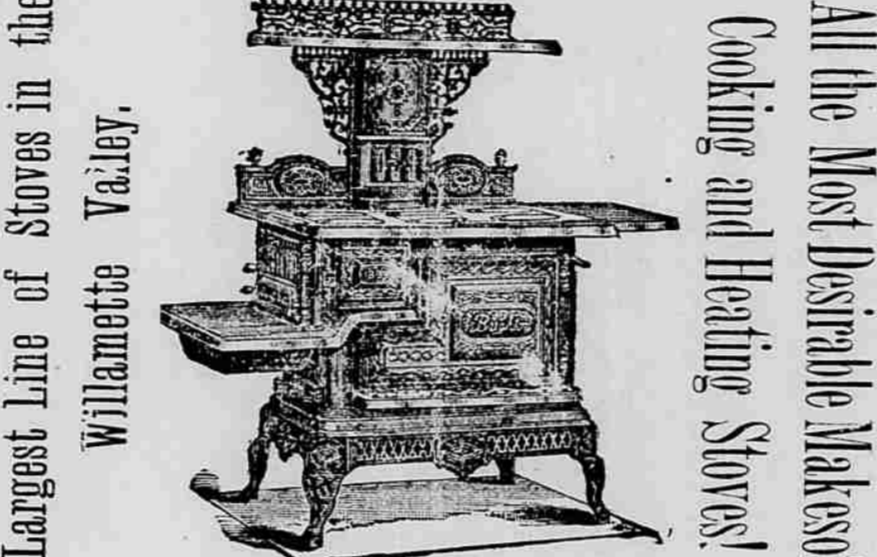
