GENERAL NEWS  
A Flurry in the Coffee Market.  
The coffee market has been in a state of great excitement since the publication of the bulletin of the Coffee Exchange, which had the effect of making a complete corner in spot coffee, and when operators having June coffee to deliver attempted to buy it they found it was all sold by S. Grumer & Co. and Crossman Bros., who represent the Bull club. In the first hour of business the price advanced 5 1/2 cents per pound, opening with the sale at 12 1/2 cents, and advancing to 13 cents on the first call on sale of 1250 bags. After the call it rose one cent at a time until noon when 18 cents was bid and no coffee found for sale. The poll brokers intimate that the outstanding contracts will be settled at 20 cents per pound. The corner continued in the afternoon, but the selling price was fixed on by the brokers for the bull houses, making the transaction at 21 cents and 21 1/2 cents per pound.

A DEMOCRATIC RATIFICATION  
Henry Watterson Delivers a Speech in Very Bad Taste.  
LOUISVILLE (Ky.), June 29.—In the course of a speech last night at a great ratification meeting here, Henry Watterson said, in reference to the republican platform: "The issue forced upon the country by the republicans is not one of protection against free trade. Let no protectionist so delude himself. If there be any, however, who seem to precipitate tree trade literally to burn down factories and blow up custom houses, he should support this republican platform and bid goodspeed to its prompt application and rigid enforcement, because, if its terms could be carried out in good faith it would terminate in such a glut of the already supplied home market, and such a consequent loss of employment to American operatives, as would surely bring the whole edifice down upon its founders. Like the original organizers of secession, which laid the axe of the revolution at the very root of the tree of slavery, though it meant to have its first step taken in the United States, it told the complete overthrow of the customs system."

GENERAL SHERIDAN.  
His Party Awaiting Him at Nonquit—His Illness.  
NEW BEDFORD, June 29.—Gen. Sheridan's children, members of his staff and several of the party, in all numbering thirteen persons, came to this city in the palace car attached to the regular train today and were forwarded in carriages to Nonquit, where they will await the general's arrival by steamer. He will not attempt to leave Washington, however, until the weather is well cleared up.

A Verdict of One Farthing.  
LONDON, June 29.—The trial of the libel suit of jocky Wood against the Licensed Victuallers Gazette, which accused him of pulling in horses, ended today, a verdict being returned awarding one farthing to the plaintiff. The amount sued for was £500. The case is the outgrowth of a famous contest between Lord Dunham and Sir George Chetwood. Wood managed the Sherrard stables, where as a consequence of the charges made against him the stewards of the jocky club refused Wood a new license for this year.  
On Trial of Murder.  
LONDON, June 29.—The steward of the ship Dovesby Hall at Liverpool from San Francisco, who fatally stabbed his captain during the voyage, has been committed for trial on a charge of murder.  
Up Goes Coal.  
NEW YORK, June 29.—The coal companies have given notice that they will advance prices about twenty-five cents a ton on the interior and western business July 1.  
Wedding in High Life.  
NEW YORK, June 29.—At 1:30 o'clock today Mrs. Lillian W. Hamnerly was married to the duke of Marlborough, by Mayor Hewitt at the city hall.
