

#### GENERAL NEWS.

The London Times on Trial for Libel.

WORKERS GAIN,

Her Assent-The Senate Fails to Confirm M. W. Fuller.

The HERALD's Special Dispatches. 1 LONDON, July 2 .- The trial of the action on Frank Hugh O'Donne'l against the London Times for libel in its articles on "Parnellism and Crime" was set for to-day. The court room was packed. Lord Chief Justice Coloridge presided. O'Donnel was represented by Mr. Rugg, a junior counsel, who is a lean, nervous, bilious looking man. Herbert Gladstone, Arthur O'Conner and many other persons of prominence were present. Herbert Gladstone sat by O'Donnell's side. The Times was represented by Attorney-General Sir James L. Smith and William Graham Glynne. Mr. Rugg, in presenting the case for the plaintiff, declared that O'Donnell was not in sympathy with the Irish exterminists. but held their methods in detestation. That the Times had no ground for coupling his name with that party, and the plaintiff therefore daimed £50,000 damages. Rugg dso said that O'Donnell had not been connected with the Parnel party since 1884.
