EDITORIAL NOTES.

In his speech advocating the bill he introduced, Mr. Mills, of Texas, said: "We produce and exchange among ourselves, and consume in the satisfaction of our wants, more of the products of our own labor than the 200,000,000 on the continent of Europe. We have invented, and have now in successful operation, more labor-saving machinery than all other people. We are turning out over six billions' worth of products of manufactures every year, and producing them at lower cost of production, and, at the same time, paying higher wages to our workmen than any other people."

THE terrible effects of opium smoking have been graphically depicted time and again, until every individual in the country is aware of the consequences of indulgence in the habit. Yet it seems that opium smoking is on the increase, judging by the list of victims. The latest is the case of the young woman of San Marcial, N. M., who succumbed to the effects of an opium debauch, and shows how the vice is spreading on this coast. This latest victim found the drug at a Chinaman's place, and smoked so much that she became unconscious, and died without recovering from the deadly stupor. As usual in such cases, the Chinese escaped, and no one can be punished for causing the death of this foolish young woman.

WATERSON, of the Louisville Courier-Journal, has been accustomed to print the Declaration of Independence on the first page of his newspaper, on the Fourth of July each recurring year. His partisan greed got the better of his judgment this year, and instead of the Declaration of Independence he printed the president's free trade message to congress. Evidently the gentleman is imbued with the old monarchial sentiment, and was only publishing the declaration heretofore to cover up his hypocrisy, and now comes out in his true colors in publishing the document that means dependence upon England, instead of independence from her dictates.

The platform of the prohibition party emphatically calls for the repeal of all liquor taxation. And yet it joins in with the democratic false accusation that the republican platform, in favoring abolition of internal revenue laws, is pledged to "free whisky." That kind of talk bears a strong resemblance to a certain prayer that commences: "I thank God that I am not as other men, etc."

Ohio's centennial celebration, which has been in progress in Marietta, in that state, on Thursday deposited the copper lined century box, which is to lie intact for one hundred years. Senator Sherman spoke, as well as a number of other prominent gentlemen, and the attendance was immense.

The precipitation of the tariff discussion as the issue of the campaign, in one sense must be highly satisfactory to President Cleveland. It is said to be conducive to the repression of personalities, which in that quarter will be very acceptable.

The burglar is playing his vocation right vigorously in Willamette Valley towns just now. Salem, Albany, Corvallis and Eugene have each been visited during the present week.

ANY man who means business and understands the same, who desires to start woolen mills at this city will receive more substantial encouragement than in any city in Oregon. An abundant water power is here, and ample capital would be subscribed to form a joint stock company, or a liberal bonus given, if some energetic woolen mill man desires to go into business in a live and growing city.

IMMIGRANTS from the faraway frozen shores of the island of Iceland are beginning to arrive in this country. A party of 140 Icelanders were landed at Castle Garden by the Anchor Line, bound for Manitoba, recently. Besides the colony in Manitoba, there is one at Sayerville, N. J., whither many of the recent arrivals are going, to engage in brick making.

A PORTLANDER named Andrew Roberts, who is New York, has expressed the belief that Oregon will go democratic next autumn. This same belief was expressed at St. Louis some weeks ago, but after they had heard from Oregon, they said they were only joking.

The democratic national central committee, it is indicated, will depend upon the President's message and the Mills bill for campaign documents. It certainly takes them a long time to hear from Oregon, or else they are blindly grave over their own folly and destruction.

INTEREST in the faraway ancient city of Jerusalem is on the increase. Recently Dr. Swartna, of New York, started for Jerusalem, with the intention of securing English and American colonists and making a commercial center of that place.
