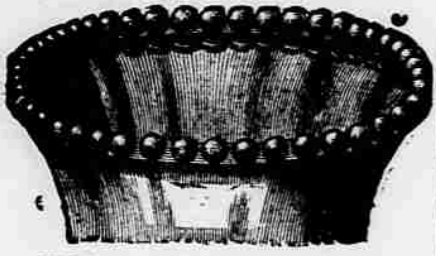


A STRANGE STORY.

Tippecanoe Medals Found in an Indian's Grave.

W. R. McCord, who remained yesterday from Warren's cannery on the Columbia river, tells the following story: On Bradford island is an Indian burying ground, where those who search may find beads and other curios. A few days since Mr. McCord took a curious railroad man over to the island to look for beads, arrowheads, etc. A prominent looking grave was selected for their subterranean work, and they had worked but a moment when the shovel brought forth a medal of apparently silver, as large as one of the dollars of our country. On removing the dirt it was found to be a Washington medal which bore, on the reverse side, the following inscription: "George Washington's Second Term, 1796." On the obverse side was a pastoral scene. It is thought that this medal was brought here by Lewis & Clarke when they came here in 1803 on their historic exploring expedition. A number of these medals were struck off and given to different chiefs. The strangest part of the story of the curious medals remains to be told. After digging a little further some eight other medals were found. These later were all alike. They were relics of the historic campaign of 1840, when William Henry Harrison and John Tyler ran for President and Vice President respectively. The medals bore the inscription, "Tippecanoe and Tyler too." Mr. McCord has promised to give Mr. Warren one of the medals to-day. The above story seems very strange and is given as it was received. As it was told by a fisherman it perhaps has a "fishy" odor.

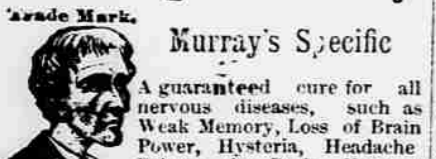

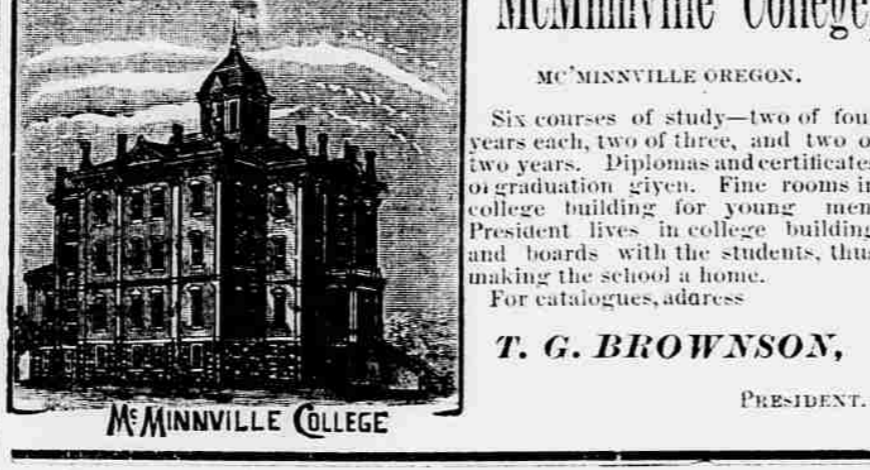
