



Southware stretches, covered with finely cultivated farms, and is one of the best grain producing sections in the state. The proposed extension will tap this splendid portion of the Willamette valley. Within a few years, it is very probable that trains will be running regularly between Corvallis and Junction and that branch will become part of the great system now owned and operated by that corporation in Oregon. The total cost of constructing the branch would not be heavy.

It is fifty miles wide and one hundred and fifty miles long and contains six thousand five hundred square miles of the best farming, fruit and stock

Its forests supply, annually, millions of feet of the finest lumber in the world which forms an important source of revenue, as well as furnishing employment to hundreds of men and making a market for produce. It must be remembered, also, that these lumbering camps are located in the mountains on either side of the valley, thus furnishing a market and also supplying lumber to all parts of the valley alike.
