FARMERS AND THE TARIFF.

The States Rights Democrat is kept very busy, now apologizing and explaining to farmers how it is that putting wool and nearly every other Oregon product on the free list, and retaining a tax of 40 per cent on the manufactured woolen goods, clothing etc., a heavy duty on sugar and other articles which the farmer has to buy, is going to improve their business. Ordinarily if the price of what we have to buy is kept up and the price of everything we have to sell is put down, we are not prosperous. This is true in farming as well as in any other business. The Democrat makes great pretensions of working for the interests of the farmers of Oregon. Can it satisfactorily explain how farmers will be benefitted by putting what they have to sell on the free list, thereby diminishing the price, and retaining a heavy tax on what they have to buy, thereby keeping the price up? This is exactly the thing proposed in Oregon by the nefarious Mills bill, and so desperately urged by the Democrat.

The straits to which the democratic campaign grinders are reduced, is exhibited by this extract from the Evening Democrat: The Democrat would reduce the duty on the twine which farmers use so extensively in harvesting from 35 to 15 per cent, while the HERALD says "no, before we would consent to give up any part of the protection on twine we would take the tax from whisky, tobacco and oleomargarine."

Horace Greeley, as pure and upright a journalist as ever wrote for the people of this country once said that a lie should be called by its true appellation. In accordance with the advice of the renowned Horace, we say that no such language as ascribed as a direct quotation from this paper ever appeared in these columns. Neither by implication, direct or indirect indorsement, did any such idea ever receive our sanction. Such dishonest, equivocating, disingenuous, barefaced falsehood of an attempt to fasten such a proposition upon the republican platform is entirely refuted by the Democrat's own argument, for it says that the materials of which grain sacks are made is not raised in this country and that the sacks themselves are manufactured in Calcutta, while the republican platform claims protection only for our own products.

We would like when the Democrat pretends to quote the HERALD for it to quote us correctly or not at all. Such misquoting is dishonest, and an ungentlemanly act on the part of any newspaper that cares anything for its reliability, and is a fair sample of some of the other campaign lies of the Democrat, which have been proved to be such, but for which it has not yet had the courage to apologize.

The course of this paper has always been for a full and fair revision of the tariff, and we have from the very start deprecated the dragging of that question into the partisan canvas, for by so doing the chances of any fair revision was entirely destroyed. The outcome of the Mills bill, which was prepared with the sole and palpable purpose of enhancing the prospects of the democratic nominees, but for which purpose it seems to have fallen far short of its mark, shows conclusively the view of the case we have advocated was the only correct one. That course has been and still is the avowed and worked for object of the republican party and platform, and will be accomplished as soon as the unhampered action of republicans can accomplish it.
