out in America for good American material and labor, and as much more as the greater consumption of the people due to their greater prosperity, would engender. If we are getting too much revenue, or if what we get is costing too much, let us get it by legislation to keep out entirely that \$700,000,000 of paper-made imports, from which the revenue is derived.

I can only add, that I think our present labor representative in congress, Henry Smith—with whom I have formerly been in sympathy—in voting for the "Mills" bill has betrayed the cause of labor, which he was elected to represent, and that I deem it my duty at the present time, temporarily sinking all other questions—to be revived at a more auspicious time—to do my utmost in this election to strengthen the republican party, which broadly and openly espouses the cause of protection to American industries.

Much interest is manifested in the forthcoming letter of acceptance of General Harrison. One of the general's intimate friends says that he has reason to believe that in his letter the General coincides with the stand the republican senators make, and uses some vigorous expressions as to how the present accumulations in the treasury will be disposed of. He favors proper coast defenses, internal improvements and the restoration of the American merchant marine. He also favors giving old soldiers the benefit of the doubt in granting pensions; the equality of the ballot and the carrying out of the civil service reform as undertaken by the republican party. The speaker said the General would also express himself on the question of public domain and the rights of fishermen.
