GENERAL NEWS.

The Chinese Bill Awaiting the Action of the President.

THE YELLOW FEVER ABATING.

A German General Found Dead with a Bullet Hole in His Head. A Court Session—Foreign News.

THE HERALD'S SPECIAL DISPATCHES.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 19.—The Chinese bill has already passed from the custody of the senate, and is in the house ready to go to the president.

YELLOW FEVER ABATING.

Reports More Encouraging. New Orleans Quarantine Raised.

NEW ORLEANS, Sept. 19.—It was reported here last night that four cases of yellow fever had developed at Galveston. The governor telegraphed for information and the assistant health officer replied that no yellow fever existed there. The governor's private secretary has been sent to Galveston to investigate.

QUARANTINE RAISED.

NEW ORLEANS, Sept. 19.—The Picayune's information sent out yesterday stating that the quarantine against New Orleans had been raised is false. The governor says it is not to be raised till he is satisfied that no fever exists in that city.

A COURT SENSATION.

Ex-Secretary Strong Found Guilty and Escapes from the Court Room.

BATON ROUGE, (La.), Sept. 19.—Yesterday afternoon the jury in the case of W. A. Strong, ex-secretary of state, charged with embezzlement, announced that a verdict had been reached. The sheriff went out to call the attorney-general and Strong followed without attracting attention and has not been seen since. The jury had found him guilty.

RAILWAY DISASTER.

A Passenger and Freight Train Collide and Kill Several People.

BERLIN, Sept. 19.—A long train bearing army recruits collided this morning with a freight train at Meppen, Hanover. Four persons were killed and a large number wounded. Twelve cars were wrecked.

A GERMAN GENERAL Found Dead with a Bullet Hole Through His Head.

PARIS, Sept. 19.—The body of General Darnle (German) with a bullet hole through his head, has been found on French territory. An inquiry is being held. It is believed to be a case of suicide.

The Sultan Declines.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Sept. 19.—The sultan has refused to sanction the protocol denouncing Turkey's rights in the Red Sea, which porte appends to the Suez combination.

Notable Death.

MEXICO, Sept. 19.—Karl Kotta, publisher, is dead.

The Dairying of the World.

The number of cows in milk or in calf is 1,910,000 for England and Wales, 395,000 for Scotland, and 1,400,000 for Ireland, whereas Denmark has nearly a million, Norway three-quarters of a million, Sweden one and a half millions, Holland one million, France, seven and a quarter millions. In other words, while Great Britain has only one cow to twelve cultivated acres, Norway has one to four, Sweden about one to eight, Denmark one to six and three-quarters acres, Germany one to ten, although she has nearly twice as many cultivated as Great Britain. The dairy system is preferred, chiefly as a means of encouraging the farmer to produce milk, which he certainly will not do under present circumstances, if he has to stand the risk of the trade in large cities, or to devote most of his time and that of his family to the manufacture of butter and cheese. With a factory at hand, good prices, little trouble, and a regular monthly check, the whole thing looks different.

Exodus of the Polygamists to a New Zion.

LARGE LAND PURCHASES.

The Utah Settlement to Be Removed Across the Mexican Line—A Good Riddance.

It is now nearly two years since the first hint began to reach the public ear concerning the extensive movement of the wealthy leaders of the Mormon Church for the establishment of a new Zion in old Mexico. The story has been both affirmed and denied several times within that interval, but in the mean time the purchase of land in Mexico has been going steadily forward, and reports have come from Salt Lake of the departure one after another of prominent families to settle in the new region. In a chat the other day S. B. Aldrich, a business man of Salt Lake who has been in New York purchasing goods, said, among other things:

"The fear of Mormon persecution and vengeance is altogether dying out in Utah. The wealth of the land has induced a steady stream of emigration from sturdy Eastern communities. The younger sons of New England and Middle States farmers have come on a quest in large numbers and the Gentile population has grown so strong that the Mormons are being pushed to the wall in every direction. There is no question whatever about this movement toward Mexico, although they have attempted to keep it the profoundest secret. The purchases there have been conducted through John W. Young, who is a son of old Brigham Young, and George Q. Cannon, who was formerly the Representative of the Territory in Congress, is an elder of the church and is wanted at Salt Lake for the violation of the Edmunds anti-polygamy law. John W. Young makes his headquarters in New York city for the most part, where he has been carrying on extensive financial operations with the capital of the Mormon church at his back. They have been building railroads and conducting land speculations, and have established a banking and commercial agency in New York city, under cover of the names of a number of Eastern men, who appear to be willing to make money out of the Mormon church as well as in other directions.

"The territory they have secured for the new occupation of the Latter Day Saints is in the land of the Zuri Indians. They have purchased outright about 4,000,000 acres of land, and have secured a Government concession for the improvement and working of about 10,000,000 acres of timber and mining land. Cannon is already a fugitive from justice, and just before I left Salt Lake it was whispered around that his wives had received a message from him at some point in the Southwest to go down with him to Mexico. The authorities were informed of the matter, but were perfectly willing that Cannon should leave the country for the country's good, if he prefers that to taking his chance with the law at Salt Lake.

"It is now understood in Utah that the church is operating on a definite plan to remove gradually all the faithful to Mexico. The allotment of families who are to go is made at the President's house. The names of all the male members of the church are thrown together in a box and then drawn out. Every tenth name is marked for departure to Mexico, and after the drawing has taken place, every tenth man gets a notice, and a certain length of time in which to dispose of his worldly possessions and take his departure if allowed him. If he owns property he is required to sell out at once. There is a pretty fair demand for property in Utah from the incoming Gentile tide, and as a rule the properties are sold to Gentiles. If it is found impossible, however, to unload in this way, the church orders it appraised and takes it off the man's hands, so that he can go to the new territory unhindered by any possessions in Utah. It is likely that several thousand Mormons will leave the Territory this winter. Many of them object to the emigration, even after they have been drawn, but the order of the Church is imperative and they are threatened with eternal damnation unless they obey instructions. The attractiveness of the new territory they have a quired in Mexico, the mildness of the climate, the fertility of the soil and the richness of the mineral deposits are all held up to them as inducements to obey the command."
