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GENERAL NEWS.

Edmunds' Chinese Resolution Laid Upon the Table
ANOTHER RAILWAY ACCIDENT.
Armed Men Guarding the Towns Stricken With Yellow Fever—Northern Pacific Election.

THE YELLOW FEVER SCOURGE.
Armed Men Guarding the Affected Towns in the South.
JACKSONVILLE, Sept. 20.—Dr. Julius Weisberber has been ordered to make an investigation at Wellborn and Fernandina as to reported cases of yellow fever in those towns. St. Augustine is happy over the clean and healthy city. Everything except the mails will be prohibited from entering that city, and the mails from Jacksonville and Gainesville are not allowed in it at all. St. Augustine is surrounded by 225 armed men.

NORTHERN PACIFIC ELECTION.
Thomas F. Oakes Elected President—An Increasing Business.
NEW YORK, Sept. 20.—The annual meeting of the stockholders of the Northern Pacific was held in this city to-day, and the only change in the board is the election of J. C. Bullitt in the place of August Belmont. Thos. F. Oakes was elected president. A report presented which showed the gross earnings of the year ending June 30th to be \$15,846,827; increase over the preceding year, \$3,056,879; of operating expenses, \$9,266,884; increase, \$2,093,865; net earnings, \$6,579,943; increase, \$663,015.

ANOTHER RAILWAY WRECK.
The Engineer and Fireman Killed Several Others Injured.
St. Louis, Sept. 20.—A wreck of the Wabash freight train occurred last night. Geo. Hendricks, engineer, and Geo. Colter, fireman, were killed. Chas. Williams, conductor, and Rudolph Stentzi, shipper, were badly injured.

John L. Sullivan Dying.
BOSTON, Sept. 20.—At 2 o'clock to-day John L. Sullivan's physicians said he was worse. It was said he was dangerously ill yesterday. At noon to-day he had a bad chill and he was then thought to be dying.

Who Knows Him?
LONDON, Sept. 20.—Advices from Taskeen state that there is a report that the ameer of Afghanistan has died suddenly.

Honors Bestowed.
CHICAGO, Sept. 20.—Senator Rosecrans has been elected president and secretary of the army of the Cumberland.

A DESPERATE FIGHT.

Shooting a Young Woman for Giving Him the Mitten.
SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 19.—A. V. Martin, employed in the auditing department of Wells, Fargo & Co's express, was arrested at 3 o'clock this morning on a charge of a suit to murder. He has been keeping company with an attractive young woman named Jessie Edwards. She told him last night that she need not call any more, and gave him the mitten. Early this morning he saw her coming out of a house with another. He hid behind the door of the Temple Bar saloon on Sutter street, and when she passed he fired four shots at her with a pistol. One of the bullets struck her side, but was stopped by a corset steel, and merely scratched her abdomen. He was held in \$1000 bail.

Sullivan Reported Dying.
BOSTON, Sept. 19.—John L. Sullivan, who has been seriously ill several days with gastric fever, is now reported dying. There is no official confirmation by the physicians, although it is understood the disease took a very serious turn for the worse during the night. No doubt Sullivan's condition is extremely critical, still his physicians refuse any definite information. At 2 o'clock this afternoon Sullivan's mother and Rev. Father Hogarty received urgent telegrams to hasten to the pugilist's bedside. They immediately left for Crescent Beach, where Sullivan is under treatment.

THE CAMPAIGN BALL.
It May be Rolled as Far West as the Pacific Coast.
WASHINGTON, Sept. 19.—The ball which was the feature of the Blaine demonstration in New York is about to start from its home, Cumberland, Md., and be rolled to Hagerstown, Md., on Tuesday and Frederick on Wednesday. At each of these points Congressmen R. W. Perkins, R. P. Kennedy, J. W. Laird and L. E. McCannas will meet it and make speeches. The huge ball will reach Washington on Thursday and be received by the national republican league with a great demonstration. From here it will go west, rolling through West Virginia and Ohio to Indianapolis, and then it may go to the Pacific coast.

RICH GOLD STRIKE.

Twenty-Five Miles from Elensburg and Near the Railroad.
ELIENSBURG, Sept. 19.—Thomas Maegher, who is engaged in mining on the Swank, cleaned up \$1400 in nuggets and fine gold. Among the nuggets was one weighing \$74. He informed the correspondent that he had traced the lode and had discovered a fine ledge, in connection with Mr. Black, which was regarded by them as the long sought mother lode. They first discovered decomposed quartz which showed from 200 to 400 colors of the pan, and after going through this they struck what they regard as the main ledge. This is free mill ore, and will assay about \$80 to the ton. This gold discovery is within twenty-five miles of Elensburg, and almost within sight of the railroad. It is regarded as the most important discovery ever made in Kittitas county. The Swank placers formerly produced heavily, and a long time ago a nugget was produced weighing \$76.

A BALL OF FIRE.
A most singular scene was witnessed on Long Lake during a storm the other day. The lake is three miles long, and is divided into three bays. About 3:15 o'clock a vivid flash of lightning illuminated the scenery, followed by a terrific peal of thunder. The wind by this time was blowing with cyclonic force. Suddenly there came a roar, and far down the lake a huge flame of fire could be seen. The water for yards around was so agitated by a gigantic wave, and the billows seemed to rise to the side of this row for fully twenty feet.
