YUQUINA NEWS.

Work commenced on the North Jetty—Location—Vessels and Shipping.

From a gentleman who returned from Yaquina yesterday it is learned that the government work has been commenced on the new north jetty. It commences a short distance above the reef of rocks around the point from Newport.

The schooner Twilight is expected to arrive at Yaquina to-day loaded with steel rails for the Oregon Pacific. She will load with wheat on her return, taking 400 tons to San Francisco.

The schooner Lottie Carson, which recently arrived with rails for the Oregon Pacific, will not take back a load of wheat as was expected, a dispatch having been received in this city last night from her owner in San Francisco that her prior charter would compel her to go to the sound for a cargo of lumber.
