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GENERAL NEWS.

Blaine Is Slightly Ill and Cancels Two Appointments.

THURMAN GOES TO WASHINGTON. News Items from East of the Rockies and the Old World—Five Men Killed in a Gas Explosion.

The Hrabats' Special Dispatches. DETROIT, Oct. 5.—In consequence of a slight cold and hoarseness which has developed since his speech in the open air yesterday at Adrian, Mr. Blaine determined this morning not to go to East Saginaw and Ithaca. His determination was strengthened by the reports of icy temperature in the northern peninsula. Mr. Blaine is at the residence of Gen. Alger, where he will remain till Monday, when he will fill his engagement at Grand Rapids. From that point he will proceed to Indiana. He will arrive at Chicago about the 17th or 18th of Oct.

There is nothing serious in his present indisposition, and the cancellation of his East Saginaw and Ithaca dates is caused simply by his desire to husband his voice.

GAS EXPLOSION. Five Workmen Seriously Burned in a Tunnel in Ohio. CLEVELAND, Oct. 5.—Five workmen were seriously burned by an explosion of gas in the water works tunnel this morning. The tunnel was lighted by an electric light, and an electric spark from one of the wires ignited the gases and caused the explosion.

A Murderer Confesses. BOSTON, (Mass.), Oct. 5.—Giovanni B. Benders surrendered himself this morning, stating that he had killed a relative named Giovanni Benders near Genoa, Italy, for interfering in a quarrel between himself and wife.

Murderer Hanged. BRIDGEPORT, (Conn.), Oct. 5.—Philip Pallioni, an Italian, who murdered his brother in cold blood on June 23d, was hanged this morning.

Boulogner Returns to Paris. PARIS, Oct. 5.—A crowd, numbering 4000 people, gathered at the railway depot to greet General Boulanger on his return to the city. The general eluded the crowd and made his way to the hotel unnoted.

Thurman Goes to Washington. COLUMBUS, (Ohio), Oct. 5.—Judge Thurman left for Washington this morning to argue the telephone case.

HARRISON AS A CURE.

His Pastor's Many Years Speaks of His Practices.

Some famous men like prophets have least honor in their own country; but truly great men, those whose greatness is inherent and not borrowed, are as well able to bear the every day scrutiny of their neighbors as the occasional glimpse of strangers. Of the latter class is Benjamin Harrison, for here is his pastor Rev. M. L. Haines of the First Presbyterian Church of Indianapolis, a man who has known the Republican Candidate for years, writing of him in a leading journal:

"There is about General Harrison an utter absence of pretence or affectation. He discards any attempt to make a show of himself, and would be the last person to speak or act for mere effect. Open and straightforward in both language and actions, he lacks that quality of politician which makes one expert at 'pulling wires' and 'laying pipes'."

"He impresses one as being a man of balanced mind and clear convictions, who would give any truth brought before him a fair chance, but who would allow nothing to swerve him from the path of duty. With him a promise is sacred, with him 'yes' means 'yes' and 'no' means 'no'. He is not a man desirous of dictating to others, nor will he allow himself to be dictated to."

"Decided in his convictions, broad in his views, inspired by a high moral purpose, ruled by a conscience both strong and informed, he has led a life in this city conspicuous for its probity and its stainless integrity."

WHAT ALES STANLEY. An African Bishop Who Doesn't Think He is in Danger. SPRINGFIELD, (Ill.) October 5.—Bishop William Taylor, the distinguished African Bishop of the Methodist Church, before leaving Springfield expressed his views on the disappearance of Henry M. Stanley, the African explorer. He said from his knowledge of the condition of things in Africa, it was highly probable Stanley had gone into the interior of the country where he could not be heard from for a year or two, and that interested persons were taking advantage of his absence to organize searching parties whose real object was something else than the recovery or assistance of Stanley. A desire for public sensation, perhaps prompted many of the publicans respecting the explorer. For his own part the Bishop did not believe there would be any special cause for alarm if Stanley was not heard from for a year or two yet.

AT THE CAPITAL. Orders to Strictly Enforce the Chinese Exclusion Act. WASHINGTON, October 5.—Acting Secretary Thompson to-day telegraphed the provisions of the Chinese Exclusion act, which went into effect yesterday, to the Collector of Customs at San Francisco and at the same time issued a circular to the Custom-house officers at other ports promulgating the law and instructing them to see to its strict enforcement. It is said that there are nearly 800 Chinese emigrants on the steamship which is expected to arrive at San Francisco on Thursday.

The President to-day nominated James Patigru Lesene of South Carolina to be Consul-General of the United States at Melbourne, Australia.

Attorney-General Garland arrived this morning from his home at Hominy Hill, Ark. He was considerably fatigued by the journey and therefore not able to attend the regular Cabinet meeting. He is said to be much improved in health since his attack of sickness during the summer. He is expected to resume his duties at the Department of Justice to-morrow.

Senator Beck's contribution to the minority report on the Tariff bill reached Washington this morning. Beck is reported to be improving, but is not yet well enough to resume active Senatorial duties.

The State Department has been informed by telegraph by Minister Buck that the treaty between Peru and this Government has been ratified by the latter.

FATAL COLLISION

Two Trains Dash Into Each Other at Fearful Speed.

BOTH ENGINES TORN TO ATOMS. The Wounded and Killed—The Disaster Caused by a Wildcat Train—Scenes of the Wreck.

Special to the Herald. (Oswego, N. Y.), Oct. 5.—A terrible collision occurred near Hannibal station on the Rome, Watertown and Ogdensburg railroad this morning. The Lehigh Valley passenger train collided with a wildcat train from Oswego, on a curve at Deep Cut. The wildcat train was running forty miles an hour, and the Lehigh Valley train forty miles. The locomotives were smashed into a thousand pieces and the cars nearly demolished. Of the wildcat train's crew Engineer Slaterly was killed, Fireman Riley was frightfully scalded, and the conductor and brakeman both were badly injured. Of the Lehigh Valley train Engineer Hatch was badly cut and scalded. Conductor Whitegate and Brakeman Smith were badly hurt and the former may die.
