A Short Session Quarterly Report.—The City's Indebtedness—Minor Matters.

Regular meeting of the city council was held last night, Mayor Cowan in the chair, and Councilmen Writsman, Read, Hoffman and Parker present. Councilmen Crawford and Tabler absent.

The committee on accounts and current expenses reported on bills and asked further time on the rebate of taxes on mortgages by Miller. The committee on fire and water reported advising not to build a cistern on account of the lack of funds; also that the old heater for No. 2's engine had been turned over to No. 1's company for use with the new engine.
